### VII. Attorney General's Report:

**a.** Director Wallace reports that DOJ is prepared to offer Jeff Rich as our new part time CalGang/DOJ legal representative. We will need to formalize this with an MOU.

#### VIII. Old Business:

- a. Continued discussion on DOJ proposal for access to CalGang data. Director Wallace provided members with a new memorandum dated February 3, 2014, to address John Gordnier's previous response memorandum dated December 30, 2014. Question and answer session began that lasted over an hour discussing the legal and technical issues. The concern by some CEB members was how to protect the integrity of the CalGang intelligence database. DOJ representatives worked to respond to this concern. Several voiced agreement that sharing the data is beneficial but doing it properly to protect the system was the, "devil in the details."
