Dear Mr. Chan

This is to confirm that pursuant to the stipulation approving receiver's ex parte motion for order authorizing distribution to claimants and the entry of the subsequent order, I have distributed checks to 3,825 claimants. The distribution was 7.14% which equates to approximately 7.2 cents per every dollar contributed by the claimants [for example if a clamant contributed \$1; then she or he would receive a distribution of approximately 7.2 cents]. The total unsecured claims filed and approved was in the amount of approximately \$ 19 million and the distribution to these claimants was in the amount of \$1,387,570.

The checks mailed to the claimants are void after 90 days of issuance and I am aware that some claimants may have moved after filing of the proof of claims or notifying me of their change of address. My attorneys and I have made every effort to incorporate any notification of change of address until a few days before issuance of the claim distribution checks. We will make every effort to ensure that if we become aware of any further address changes, we will forward the returned checks to the new address assuming we have it. After a reasonable period of time the checks which have not been cashed will be forwarded to the State of California with the name and the last known address of the claimant. We will endeavor to include social security numbers if available.

The receiver's final report and the appropriate fee applications will be filed with the Court for approval in due course after the completion of the receivership administration.

I am holding approximately 430 bankers boxes which includes CAMAA's business records at Public Storage in Mountain View, CA. These boxes will be destroyed in an appropriate manner after getting Court approval. I anticipate these records will be destroyed no later than June 2013.

I would like to thank you and your office for the excellent support and contribution which you have made to ensure that claimants receive their share of distribution in a timely manner.
