Prize

Each of the three types of qualifying hands will have its own progressive prize pool. The progressive prize pool jackpot will have no cap. When a player makes a qualifying hand, as shown above, the player shall be awarded the posted jackpot according to the corresponding amount listed on the board. The house funded seed amount will vary between \$10 and \$25 a day and progressive amounts will be added daily at midnight. SUMMARY

Based on customer demand and industry trends, Napa Valley Casino (NVC) proposes to add a gaming activity for all Bureau approved Blackjack games. The promotion will award players who play in the controlled games listed above and make a designated qualifying hand.

BASE GAME RULES

All base game rules that have been approved by the Bureau of Gambling Control for the above listed game will be followed. There are no changes whatsoever.

PRIZE

The prize will be a fixed cash amount ranging between the minimum of \$50 and the maximum of \$10,000. All prizes of \$5,000 or less will be paid in casino chips. All prizes of \$5001 or more will be paid within 48 hours by check.

When a winning hand is confirmed, one hundred percent (100%) of the posted prize amount will be paid to the winner(s).

FUNDING

This promotion will be solely funded by the NVC. There will be no extra collection or fees of any kind assessed to the players.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for this gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in The Napa Valley Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered:

- Corresponding time played and Player Rewards Points amount.
- The date(s) and time(s) the gaming activity shall be offered.
- How the number of points earned corresponds to the amount in prize value.
