I am writing to **OPPOSE** the proposed regulations that hinder The 101 Casino's ability to waive collections fees in controlled games. These proposed regulations will cause me to **LOSE MY JOB** at The 101 Casino and put my family's future at risk. Moreover, the City of Petaluma will suffer a sharp reduction in general fund revenue much of which funds police and fire support in our area.

If the Bureau requires that card rooms such as The 101 Casino charge fees on every hand played, we will be at a serious competitive disadvantage to local tribal casinos and suffer a drastic loss of revenue. The 101 Casino has provided safe, legal gaming while contributing LIVING WAGE JOBS and VITAL TAX REVENUE to the City of Petaluma.
