TO: ALL CALIFORNIA LAW ENFORCEMENT TELECOMMUNICATIONS (CLETS) USERS


Recent changes to the California Department of Justice (DOJ), Supervised Release File (SRF), were implemented to allow agencies the ability to select Electronic Device Search Condition in the General Search and Seizure (GSS) data field pursuant to California Penal Code (PC) section 1546.1(c).

Senate Bill No. 1121 (Chapter 541, Statutes of 2016) amended California (PC) section 1546.1(c), to authorize government entities access to electronic devices, if the device is seized from an authorized possessor of the device who is subject to an electronic device search as a clear and unambiguous condition of probation, mandatory supervision, or pretrial release.

GSG	General Search and Seizure Group	Group, 2 alpha characters	This is a group field and must be coded with the AJI and GSS information. Format: GSG/aji.gss
AJI	Adult/Juvenile Information	1 alpha character	A = Adult J = Juvenile
GSS	General Search and Seizure	1 alpha character	A = General Search and Seizure I = Not Indicated (Juvenile) B = Search and Seizure, Narcotics C = Search and Seizure, Stolen Property Only D = Search and Seizure, Limited to Weapons E = Search and Seizure, Limited to Other N = None F = Electronic Device Search Condition
