Subject: Important Notice About Your Bodybuilding.com Account

Notice of Data Breach

Dear Valued Bodybuilding.com User,

Bodybuilding.com recently became aware of a data security incident that may have affected certain customer information in our possession. We have no evidence that personal information was accessed or misused, but we are notifying you out of an abundance of caution to explain the circumstances as we understand them and to summarize the steps we are undertaking and the resources we are making available.

What Happened?

Bodybuilding.com became aware of a data security incident involving unauthorized access to its systems in February 2019. Bodybuilding.com engaged one of the leading data security firms to conduct a thorough investigation, which traced the unauthorized activity to a phishing email received in July 2018. The investigation also determined that some data was removed from Bodybuilding.com systems, but the nature of the files taken is unknown. On April 12, we concluded our investigation and could not rule out that personal information may have been accessed.

What Information Was Involved?

Information that you provided to us which might have been accessed in this incident could include your name, email address, Bodybuilding.com password, billing/shipping addresses, phone number, order history, any communications with Bodybuilding.com, birthdate, and any information you included in your BodySpace profile. Note that profile information is generally already publicly visible to others, as noted in our applicable Privacy Policy and Terms of Use.

The information potentially accessed in this incident would not include your full credit or debit card number, as we do not store those numbers when customers make purchases in our store. If you've opted to store your card in your account, we store the last four digits of your payment card number for reference and use by you for subsequent purchases, but never the entire card number.

What We Are Doing:

Upon discovering the incident, Bodybuilding.com took steps to understand the nature and scope of the data security incident, and brought in external forensic consultants that specialize in cyber attacks. We're working with leading security experts to address any vulnerabilities and remediate the incident. We continue to monitor our systems for unauthorized access, have introduced additional security measures, and will be resetting Bodybuilding.com customers' passwords on their next log-in. We are also coordinating with law enforcement to investigate the incident.

What You Can Do:

We recommend that you take the following steps to protect against and monitor for potential misuse of your personal information:

- Change your password for any other account on which you used the same or similar password used for your Bodybuilding.com account.
- Review your accounts for suspicious activity.
- Be cautious of any unsolicited communications that ask for your personal information or refer you to a website asking for personal information.
- Avoid clicking on links or downloading attachments from suspicious emails.
