TO: ALL CALIFORNIA LAW ENFORCEMENT TELECOMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM (CLETS) USERS

The purpose of this information bulletin is to inform all CLETS users of the new Investigative Search Tool (IST) feature available within LEAWeb. The IST allows users to perform searches of multiple California Department of Justice (DOJ) databases using various search parameters. Additionally, the search provides enhanced ad-hoc search capabilities, including a free text experience that allows the user to search using limited information. The interface offers filters to assist the user when performing a search. The following DOJ databases are available in the IST search:

- Armed and Prohibited Persons System
- Automated Boat System
- Automated Criminal History System
- Automated Firearms System
- Automated Property System
- California Restraining and Protective Order System
- California Sex and Arson Registry
- Missing and Unidentified Persons System
- Stolen Vehicles System
- Supervised Release File
- Wanted Persons System

CLETS subscribing agencies with established access to LEAWeb that are interested in obtaining access to the LEAWeb IST, please see the below:

For existing LEAWeb users: the Agency CLETS Coordinator must submit a LEAWeb IST Request Form (<https://clew.doj.ca.gov/publications/leaweb-ist-request-form>), with all applicable users listed, to the CLETS Administration Section (CAS) at CAS@doj.ca.gov. If the LEAWeb IST is being requested for existing users, the LEAWeb IST Request Form is the only form required.

For new LEAWeb users: the Agency CLETS Coordinator must submit both a Terminal Access Request Form (TARF) located on CLEW at: <https://clew.doj.ca.gov/system/files/forms/termreq2.pdf>, and the updated LEAWeb User Interface Display (UID) Request Form with the IST column completed
