

Bad Beat Promotion

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Casino 99 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001186) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Casino 99 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods
- Qualifying hand(s)
- Prize amount and payout structure
- Qualifying hands and corresponding jackpot prize amount
- Jackpot fee amount
- Availability of No Purchase Necessary
- Any other restrictions that apply to this promotion

Eligible Controlled Games

The Bad Beat Promotion shall be attached to the following Bureau approved controlled games offered at Casino 99, as shown below, at all times this gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

- Texas Hold'em (GEGA-000785)
- Omaha High-Low Split (9 Qualifier) (GEGA-000783)

Object and Summary

The Bad Beat Promotion features a progressive jackpot prize. A prize is awarded to active players participating in any of the above controlled games when a designated qualifying hand is beaten by a better hand. When a designated qualifying hand is beaten by a better hand, the house dealer will inform a casino representative. The casino representative will verify both hands via video surveillance. Once the winning and losing hands are confirmed by video surveillance, those players with the qualifying jackpot hands shall receive the posted percentage of the jackpot prize amount immediately from the cage by the Casino representative.

The table where the Bad Beat Promotion is made at shall also be eligible for a posted percentage of the jackpot prize, referred to as the Table Share. The Table Share shall be evenly distributed among all other players participating at the table at the time the jackpot is hit. If the share of odd amounts is less than a dollar, then they are paid in coin. If there is still an odd amount, the Casino will add the difference to make sure the amounts are the same.

Casino 99 will utilize a white board to display the prize amounts, days and times of the promotion.

Bad Beat Promotion

Qualifying Hands

Players who make one of the following qualifying hands for any of the controlled games listed above shall be eligible to win their share of the Bad Beat Promotion prize amount, as shown below. The losing hand must be the second best hand to qualify for the jackpot.

Furthermore, the qualifying winning and losing hands shall be displayed prominently within the Casino at all times the Bad Beat Promotion is being offered for play.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours posted for the gaming activity.

- There is a minimum of two players required to be seated and actively playing in an above mentioned game for the table to qualify for the jackpot.
- Players must use two hole cards to qualify for this promotion.
- In the event two or more players make a qualifying winning and/or losing hand, the player with the highest qualifying winning and losing hand shall win the posted percentage of the prize for the hand. All other players shall win the posted percentage of the Table Share.
- When a qualifying hand is announced, a casino representative will verify both hands qualify. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the jackpot.
- The games, as listed above, need not be played through the showdown. In all games participating in the promotion, all hands involved in a showdown, including "all in" hands, must be shown or any potential of qualifying for the jackpot will be voided.
- The losing hand must be the second-best hand to qualify for the jackpot.
- The qualifying winning and losing hands will be prominently displayed on a white board for all patrons and players to view.
- There is no restriction on the number of times a player may qualify for or win a prize.
- Tournament games do not qualify for this promotion.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate when on or off duty and in or out of uniform.

Prize

Players who make the pre-determined and posted qualifying losing and winning hands shall be eligible to win the corresponding progressive prize amount. The prize will be paid out in cash from the cage by a casino representative. The prize amount shall range from \$1 to \$100,000.

Prize Payout Structure

The prize payout structure will be as follows, 50% of the posted progressive jackpot prize amount shall be awarded to the player that makes the qualifying losing hand, 25% of the posted progressive jackpot prize amount shall be awarded to the player that makes the qualifying winning hand, and 25% of the posted progressive jackpot prize amount shall be evenly divided and distributed amongst all other players who played in the round, known as the table share.

Bad Beat Promotion

*Table Share: the posted percentage of the jackpot prize that shall be evenly distributed among all other players participating at the table at the time the jackpot is hit.

Funding

This promotion will be fully funded by Casino 99. There will be no additional jackpot fees or collection fees taken for this promotion. Once the prize has been awarded, the Casino shall re-seed the jackpot at an amount ranging from \$1 to \$10,000. The progressive prize amount shall increase in an amount ranging from \$1 to \$1,000 either daily, weekly, or monthly at the Casino's discretion, and all funds added to the progressive jackpot shall be clearly documented in accounting records. No funds added to the progressive prize amount shall be deducted for any reason other than to pay a winning jackpot prize.

Administrative Fees

The Casino will not retain an administrative fee, as this promotion is house funded.

No Purchase Necessary

The Bad Beat Promotion shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with **no restrictions**. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Bad Beat Promotion. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Casino 99 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play

- Eligible games.
- Specific dates and/or time periods of when the gaming activity will be offered.
- Specific number of tickets earned for each qualifying activity or time played.
- Date and time of drawing and corresponding number of tickets drawn.
- Qualifying hands.
- Specific means for the patron to select the prize.
- Specific prize amount and/or non-cash prize(s) and descriptions.
- Requirements for tournament winners to earn tickets.
- Restrictions on if a player is required to be present/claim their prize in a certain amount of time.

Object and Summary

During pre-determined and posted times, players will be eligible to earn a ticket(s) to be entered into a drawing to receive a prize. Players earn a ticket(s) for the drawing promotion as noted in the chart below. If players make the specific qualifying hand in order to be eligible to spin the wheel, the section the wheel lands on will determine the number of tickets the player will earn to be entered into the drawing. Players can also earn a ticket(s), as shown below, based on the amount of time played at the above listed eligible controlled games. Players must play a minimum of 15 minutes in California games and a minimum of 30 minutes in Poker games.

Drawing Promotion

The drawing promotion event will last between 30 to 120 days with the actual drawing occurring at the end of the promotional period. The actual drawing date and times will be predetermined and prominently posted on the gaming floor. All options for earning a ticket(s) shall be offered together at all times this gaming activity is being offered for play:

Qualifying Activity	Number of Tickets

Players who have earned tickets will have their first and last name written on the back of every ticket the player has earned by the manager or Key employee on duty. All tickets, regardless of how they are earned, shall be placed into one drawing bin.

Qualifying Hands

Players who achieve one of the following advertised hands shall win the opportunity to spin the wheel. The qualifying hands within the chart below shall be offered together at all times this gaming activity is being offered for play. When a qualifying hand is announced, a Casino 99 employee shall verify the hand qualifies.

- Qualifying hands in the applicable poker games do not have to use two hole cards, except when the qualifying hand is Aces Cracked, and then players must have both aces in their hole cards

Drawing Promotion

When a player obtains one of the qualifying hands listed above, they will spin the wheel. The wheel has 38 sections with each section depicting a specific number, between 00, and 0 to 36; this represents how many ticket(s) the player will receive, according to the chart below.

Time Required

Players who play for a designated amount of time in a Poker or California game shall also be eligible to earn a ticket(s). Players must play a minimum of 15 minutes in California games and a minimum of 30 minutes in Poker games. For every subsequent 15 minute (for California games) and 30 minute (for Poker games) time period, the player will earn the ticket(s) as listed above. Players must check in with casino staff when they sit down to play; casino staff will notify the manager. The manager will track players' time played on a log at the table or through the Player Rewards Program (GEGA-004099). The log will contain the players first and last name, the game played, and the time played. When the player notifies casino staff they are leaving the table, they shall receive their ticket(s) to be entered in the drawing.

Drawing

The drawing bin will be located in plain sight on the gaming floor and the tickets will be placed in the drawing bin until the end of the drawing promotion. During pre-determined and posted times, there will be a specified number of drawings where tickets shall be drawn. The ticket selection shall take place on the casino floor and will be done manually. Each entry is represented by a ticket, which will be a standard single roll raffle ticket. The tickets are placed in a cage like device or cylinder and mixed up. Tickets are drawn from the cage like device or cylinder at random by a designated casino employee. The player(s) whose ticket(s) is drawn will be awarded the pre-determined and designated prize. The drawing bin will be emptied at the end of each drawing promotion event and the remaining tickets will be discarded. No tickets will be carried over to the next drawing promotion.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the pre-determined specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- All qualifying hands must be verified by Casino personnel in order to be eligible.
- During a round of play, if two or more players have qualifying hands, each player shall be eligible to spin the wheel and receive a ticket(s) based on their spin of the wheel.
- When a player achieves a qualifying hand, and it is verified by Casino personnel, the player will then get the opportunity to spin the wheel.
- A minimum of two players, (a player and player-dealer for California games) are required to be dealt into an eligible game in order for the players to be eligible for this gaming activity.
- In California games, backline bettors are not eligible for this promotion.

Drawing Promotion

- In Poker games, players do not have to use both hole cards in a qualifying hand to be eligible, except for the Aces Cracked qualifying hand where both hole cards must be used.
- The wheel must make one complete rotation for the spin to be valid.
- Once the wheel has been spun and is in motion, no one may interfere with the rotation of the wheel. Any interference with the rotation of the wheel shall invalidate the spin, and the wheel shall be re-spun.
- The wheel must come to a complete stop before a determination is made as to what prize is won.
- For a spin to be valid, the pointer must come to rest between two of the pegs.
 - If the pointer gets stuck or rests upon one of the pegs, the spin shall be invalid and the wheel shall be re-spun.
- All spins declared invalid by the supervising floor-person shall be re-spun as per these rules.
- Once the wheel has stopped and has been verified as a valid spin, the player will then be awarded the amount of ticket(s) corresponding to the number on the wheel.
 - The ticket(s) will be awarded by a Casino manager or Key employee on duty.
 - Players who have earned a ticket(s) will have their first and last name written on the back of the ticket by the manager or Key employee on duty.
- Players must be present at the time of the drawing promotion in order to be eligible for the prize.
 - If a player does not respond within 5 minutes after their name is called, that ticket would be put back into the bin and another ticket will be drawn.
- Tickets can only be used by the player who earned them. The winning player will have their name verified by Casino personnel.
- Patrons or casino staff may place tickets in the drawing promotion bin. Tickets can be deposited in the drum before the drawing is held.
- When the tickets are drawn for the prize, if an employee was to draw their own ticket, it would be placed back in the bin and another ticket will be drawn.
- Only off duty, in or out of uniform, casino employees, including poker proposition players, are eligible to participate in the promotion to earn a ticket(s) and place them in the bin. If the drawing takes place while the casino employee is on duty, they are eligible to win the prize.
- Third Party Providers of Proposition Player Services are not eligible to earn tickets or win any prizes on or off duty.
- The promotion shall be valid during tournament play.

Prize

The prize, per drawing ticket, shall be a fixed amount ranging in value from \$10 to \$5,000. The prize shall be in the form of cash, entry into tournaments or merchandise such as Casino 99 Logo apparel, televisions or other electronics, trips, drones, and gift cards. The prizes for this promotion shall be pre-determined and prominently displayed on the gaming floor.

Because there are multiple prizes to be won and multiple tickets drawn, the Casino shall use a random means to determine which prize is awarded when the winning ticket is drawn. Patrons will be provided with ample advance notice of the means that will be available for the patron to choose from for the prize. All prize drawings will be in front of the patrons and visible to surveillance cameras. The random means of determining the prize can be:

Drawing Promotion

- **Balloon:** The casino will place a small folded piece of paper with the prize written on the piece of paper inside a balloon. The patron will choose a balloon from a pre-determined and posted number of balloons being. The balloons will be tied and secured in such a manner as to display the balloons in a bunch. Once the patron chooses a balloon, a casino floor person will get the balloon and use a thumb tack or stick pin to pop the balloon and reveal the piece of paper with the prize written on it the patron has won. Patrons will be provided with ample advance notice of how many balloons will be available for the patron to choose from for the prize.
- **Envelope:** The casino will place a small folded piece of paper with the prize written on the piece of paper inside an envelope. The patron will choose an envelope from a pre-determined and posted number of envelopes being held by a casino floor person. Once the patron chooses an envelope, the casino floor person will hand the envelope to the patron so the patron can open the envelope to reveal the piece of paper with the prize written on it the patron has won. Patrons will be provided with ample advance notice of how many balloons will be available for the patron to choose from for the prize.
- **Drum:** The plastic drum would be sealed and of a size so the drum can be opened on top or bottom to insure all the tickets can be mixed. The drum would be able to spin in a way that after spinning the drum, a casino employee would be able to open the drum from the top or the bottom based on the number of times you turned the drum. The ticket will come from a standard single roll raffle ticket and will have the customers name on it. The customer will write their name on the ticket and give it to a casino floor person to place in the drum before the drawing. The ticket selection shall take place on the casino floor and will be done manually. The drawing bin will be emptied at the end of each drawing promotion event and the remaining tickets will be discarded. No tickets will be carried over to the next drawing promotion.

Funding

The Drawing promotion is fully funded by Casino 99. There shall be no additional jackpot fees or collection fees taken in order to fund this gaming activity or for players to participate.

Administrative Fee

Casino 99 shall not retain an administrative fee as this promotion is house funded.

No Purchase Necessary

The Drawing promotion shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with **no restrictions**, to patrons who wish to participate in a No Purchase Necessary game. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. **All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Drawing Promotion. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.**

Drawing Promotion

Wheel

The wheel has 38 sections, numbered 00, and 0 through 36, with each section depicting a specific number. This number represents how many tickets the player will receive. The wheel has a stand or is attached to the wall and is large enough for all players to view throughout the casino. The wheel is balanced and has rods on the face protruding forwards. An elastic pointer falls between the rods. A sample of the wheel is shown below. The three colors do not represent any amount of tickets, only the numbers represent a quantity of tickets to be won per the aforementioned Qualifying Activity chart.



High Hand Promotion

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Casino 99 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001130) will be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, will be prominently displayed in Casino 99 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible controlled games and time periods
- Prize amount
- Current high hand for each game
- Availability of No Purchase Necessary
- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity

Eligible Controlled Games

The High Hand Promotion shall be attached to all Bureau approved poker games offered at Casino 99 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

The High Hand Promotion features a fixed prize element that awards the player who obtains the highest-ranking poker hand in each eligible game during a predetermined and posted time period with a predetermined and posted fixed prize ranging from \$1 to \$100,000. There is no minimum qualifying hand for this promotion. The player with the highest-ranking poker hand will win the predetermined and posted prize amount.

Example: Player A has the highest-ranking hand in Texas Hold'em at the end of the promotional period and Player B has the highest-ranking hand in Omaha at the end of the promotional period. Each player would win the respective prize for that game.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity will be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- There is no limit on how many times a player may win a prize during any given promotional period.
- In games that utilize two or more hole cards, the player must use a minimum of two hole card in order to qualify.
- A minimum of four players must be dealt into the game in order to be eligible for this promotion.
- All qualifying high hands must be verified by a casino representative in order for the hand to be eligible.
- In the event two or more players achieve the same qualifying high hand, the prize value will be split equally among the eligible players.
 - If there is an odd amount, the Casino will add funds to make the amounts equal.
- Players do not need to be present to win and will have one week to claim their prize.

High Hand Promotion

- Players who fail to claim their prize within the posted timeframe will forfeit the prize.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate in the promotion on or off duty, in or out of uniform.
- Tournament games do not qualify for this promotions.

Prize

The prize for each game will be a fixed amount ranging from \$1 to \$100,000 and will be paid in cash. All prizes for this promotion will be predetermined and posted in advance, throughout the gaming floor and in all literature promoting such event.

Funding

This promotion will be fully funded by Casino 99. There will be no fees of any kind taken for this promotion.

Administrative Fees

The Casino will not retain an administrative fee, as this promotion is house-funded.

No Purchase Necessary

The High Hand Promotion shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with **no restrictions**. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. **All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the High Hand Promotion. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.**

OMAHA BAD BEAT JACKPOT**

1. **Name of Proposed Gaming Activity:**
Omaha Bad Beat Jackpot

2. **Name each controlled game that is associated with this gaming activity:**
Omaha

3. **Describe any Jackpot or any other type of prize awarded:**
A jackpot will be awarded that is an amount between two hundred dollars (\$200) and ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).

4. **If a cash prize is involved, is the amount progressive or a fixed amount?**
The cash prize will be a fixed amount.

5. **Explain if the gaming activity is House funded or player funded:**
The jackpot will be house funded.

6. **Describe any special fee collection involved in this gaming activity, for example, a Jackpot collection fee.**
There is no special fee collection for this activity.

7. **Describe how the Jackpot will be seeded and how prizes will be awarded.**
When a player who is holding a specified qualifying hand (second best hand) loses to another player, on the same table, with another specified qualifying hand (best hand), the jackpot occurs. Both players holding those qualifying hands and all of those players who played during the round of play in which jackpot occurred will receive a predetermined portion of the posted jackpot. Both qualifying hands must use both of their hole cards to make their best hand. The qualifying hands are as shown below:

Option A

Losing Hand	Winning Hand
8-8-8-8 or Better	Higher Ranked Four of a Kind or Better

Option B

Losing Hand	Winning Hand
J-J-J-J or Better	Higher Ranked Four of a Kind or Better

Option C

Losing Hand	Winning Hand
Straight Flush or Better	Higher Ranking Straight Flush or Royal Flush

In the event that during a round of play, two (2) or more players are dealt qualifying hands, only the highest ranked winning and losing hands will qualify to receive the posted prize percentage for the winning and losing prize. The remaining player(s), including those who received lower ranked qualifying hands, will receive the posted prize percentage of the table share.

Players with qualifying winning and losing hands must play through the final betting round, after the river, in order to qualify for the jackpot. If a player folds prior to the final betting round, the table will be in-eligible for the jackpot.

When two players, at the same table, obtain and produce the qualifying losing and winning hands, as shown above, a shift manager on duty will verify both hands. Immediately thereafter, the deck of cards will be suited and verified for integrity and accuracy. All jackpot occurrences will also be reviewed and verified by a member of the casino surveillance team for accuracy of procedures. Players' identifications will be obtained prior to payment of any jackpot prize. The names and information of those players will be recorded and maintained as a part of jackpot recordkeeping for the purpose of reference and audit. All required and necessary paperwork and forms will be filled out and recorded prior to payment of jackpot prizes. Prizes will be paid in form of cash or chips.

8. Explain any prize distribution including prizes given to the winner, loser, or any other player or patron.

When these qualifying hands are shown at a conclusion of a round of play and verified by the Club, the jackpot will be in effect and all qualifying players will be paid accordingly, as shown below:

Option A

Option B

Option C

Losing Hand	Winning Hand	Table Share

The available prize will be posted on a board centrally located in the Casino.

9. Explain any re-seeding of the fund once the prize is won.

When the jackpot is hit, 100% of the amount listed on the jackpot board shall be available for the jackpot payout, which shall also be listed on the jackpot board. Angie's Poker Club will immediately re-seed the jackpot.

The jackpot will initially be seeded by Angie's Poker Club in an amount ranging between \$200 and \$10,000. Angie's Poker club will reseed the jackpot in the full amount.

10. Explain any minimum or maximum number of players required to be dealt into the game for the table to be eligible for the gaming and activity prize.

A minimum of four (4) players are needed to participate in a live game in order for the table to be eligible for the jackpot. Ten (10) is the maximum number of players allowed at a table.

- 12. Describe any opportunity(s) for the person to play for the prize without placing any live wagers or paying any table fees.**

The Omaha Bad Beat Jackpot will be offered for free, on a “general and indiscriminate” basis, to patrons who wish to participate in a No Purchase Necessary game. Angie’s Poker Club will provide a table for all patrons who request to participate in the jackpot without paying a table fee or a jackpot collection fee. There will not be live wagers at these tables. Participants in No Purchase Necessary tables will be eligible to win the jackpot prize if they participate in a game where players obtain the designated jackpot hands. When any person(s) comes to play the jackpot at the "No Purchase Necessary" table, the dealer will deal the maximum of nine hands. Each No Purchase Necessary player will play only one hand and the casino dealer will play the remaining. If the player(s) wins the jackpot, only the portion of money that his/her hand qualifies for will be paid. The remainder will remain in the jackpot fund. This will be done in the interest of fairness and in the spirit of the law, and as to give the No Purchase Necessary player the maximum opportunity to win a portion of the Jackpot Prize. No Purchase Necessary tables follow the identical rotation procedure as a live game.

- 14. Identify any entity or person other than those licensed as the house involved in the gaming activity.**

A jackpot element will be added to the game of Omaha, there will be no new tables or equipment utilized for the play of this game.

Player Rewards Program RULES

Advertisement Requirements

The Casino 99 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino 99 advertise a different name, the BGC ID listed shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to the Player Rewards Program gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for this gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be displayed conspicuously and prominently in The Casino 99 at all times the gaming activity is being offered:

- Corresponding time played and Player Rewards Points amount awarded.
- The date(s) and time(s) the gaming activity shall be offered.
- The prize(s) offered for meeting the requirements of the gaming activity.
- Corresponding points & prize amount.
- Any other applicable restrictions.

Controlled Games

The Player Rewards Program gaming activity shall be attached to all currently approved game limits and versions of the approved games offered at the Casino 99 while this gaming activity is being offered for play. All game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

Rules of Play

The Player Rewards Program features a promotional element attached to the games listed above. This gaming activity is a loyalty reward program open to all Casino 99 patrons. This promotion will reward players with Player Rewards Points based on time of play at designated table games during pre-determined and eligible periods.

How Prizes are Earned Based on Time Played

Prizes shall be earned by the amount of time played. Each player that plays a Bureau approved game shall swipe or log in with their Player's Club Card and have their hours played tracked. Players will earn 1-10 points per hour played. Players shall be able to redeem their points at a rate of \$.40 to \$10.00 per point.

How Prizes are Redeemed

Players may either redeem their Player Rewards Points at any time during the promotion. All prizes shall have a pre-determined and designated value. After a player has accumulated a pre-determined and specific amount of Player Rewards Points, based on time of play, a player may redeem the accrued Player Rewards Points for a pre-determined and designated prize.

- After a player has been awarded a prize, they may also be eligible for multiple and subsequent prize(s) until the end of the promotion.

Player Rewards Program RULES

- A player may view the amount of Player Rewards Points they have earned by having a Casino employee scan their card at any time.
- Hours are non-transferrable, and can only be used by the player who earned them.

Player's Club Card System Description

The Player's Club Card shall include the Casino logo and name of the card, the player's name, some descriptive language regarding restrictions for the card, and the problem gambling phone number. It shall also include a bar-code and player number unique to each player in the Casino 99 Player Reward Management System. Although the system may have the ability to utilize a "random number generator," this feature shall not be used until approved by the Bureau of Gambling Control.

- The card shall be non-transferable, and revocable at management's discretion.
- Player information shall be maintained in a secure database accessed only by casino management. Access to the database shall also be tracked by casino management.
- Points in accounts with no new activity (points accrued) for a period of six months shall expire. The account shall remain in the system indefinitely.
- Players are tracked per hour by having their card scanned or logged in by a designated floor person when they sit down to start playing. They remain in the system accruing time for the full hour until another scan is completed.
- Only the network administrator(s) has access to the back-end systems where the data is stored. Access to the data is by user level with multiple levels based on what the user will be doing. Managers can edit time (i.e. if the player forgot to have their card swiped and need time added), floor persons can log players into the system if the player forgot their card.
- All data is backed up.
- A printable record of the amount of time a player has accumulated during the period of time that the gaming activity is being offered, shall be available at anytime at their request.

Prize

The prize amount shall be a fixed amount ranging from \$5 to \$10,000. Examples of prizes include cash, jewelry, electronics, clothing, vehicles, gift certificates, concert tickets, food comps, entry into tournaments or into other approved gaming activities. etc. In all instances, the actual prize(s) that players are eligible to redeem their hours for shall be pre-determined and conspicuously posted in the Casino 99 at all times that this gaming activity is being offered. All promotions offered in concurrence with the Player Rewards Program shall be

approved by the Bureau prior to offering the promotion for play. All Federal and State tax laws will apply if applicable.

All fee collections and table limits are for the designated base game and are Bureau approved, pre-determined and posted at each table.

Administrative Fees

The Casino 99 shall not retain an administrative fee as the Player Rewards Program gaming activity is funded by the Casino 99.

No Purchase Necessary

The Player Rewards Program does not contain the element of chance. Therefore, it does not constitute an illegal lottery and does not require a No Purchase Necessary table to be offered while conducting this promotion.

Poker Tournaments

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Casino 99 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEGA-001814) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to the gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Casino 99 at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- How a player may enter the tournament.
- The game(s) that will be offered during the play of the tournament.
- The fees that will be charged for entering the tournament, including a description for each fee charged and whether it shall be retained by Casino 99, added directly into the tournament prize pool, or any other method of retention or distribution.
- The amount of tournament chips that will be awarded to each player upon entry into the tournament.
- The tournament prize structure that will be offered and the number of players that will be paid.
- When the patron(s) will be paid and the manner in which they will be paid.
- The rules and procedures for any and all gaming activities that being offered in conjunction with the Poker Tournaments.
- Patrons will be given ample notice of which option is being offered and it will be displayed prominently via printed flyers, digital display, and any other forms of advertisements that the club uses to promote the tournament(s).
- Any other restrictions that apply to the Poker Tournaments.

Tournament Log

The Casino 99 shall maintain all completed tournament logs for at least seven years. These logs shall be maintained in either paper or electronic format. The cardroom shall also retain and make available the most recent three months of the tournament logs for inspection by a representative of the Bureau during all hours of operation. Upon request of the Bureau, a licensee shall provide the Bureau with copies of such tournament logs. Tournament logs shall contain the following information:

- Name of Gambling Establishment
- Day, date, time and name advertised for the tournament
- Total number of tables used
- Name of controlled games offered
- Method of entry and amount of any entry fees
- Number and amount of rebuys and/or add-ons offered
- Source of all funds for tournament prize pool
- Number of participants
- Name of each fee charged, amount of each fee charged, total number of each fee collected, and cumulative amount of charged
- Amount of the prize pool
- Amount and reason for any deductions from the total collected prize pool
- Name of gaming activities offered (when applicable)

Poker Tournaments

- Funding source
- Prize amount
- Total number of prizes awarded
- Total amount deducted from prize pool (when applicable)
- Results of the tournament, including the amount paid out and amount paid for each place in the tournament
- Signature of casino staff responsible for administering the tournament

Eligible Controlled Games

The Poker Tournaments shall be attached to all Bureau approved Poker controlled games offered at the Casino 99 at all times that the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled games shall be played as approved by the Bureau.

Gaming Activities Offered During Tournament Play

Bounties

Bounties may be offered during a tournament, as noted below:

- Bounty tournaments include additional prize money that is funded from a 'bounty fee,' which is paid by the players. Bounty fees will be the same for all tournament players.
- Bounty targets are tournament players who are selected prior to the start of the tournament. Selected players will receive a 'bounty token' which will be placed on the gaming table with their tournament chips. If a bounty player loses all of their tournament chips during a hand of play, the bounty player will surrender their 'bounty token' to the winner of that hand.
- When a player has been eliminated from the tournament, any 'bounty tokens' a player has acquired will be redeemed for cash equal to the amount of the bounty prize pool divided by the number of bounty targets. If a bounty target wins the tournament event, that player shall redeem their token in addition to any other 'bounty tokens' acquired.
- The cardroom at their discretion may or may not announce the Bounty player.

Points System

Object and Summary

During a predetermined and posted time period, Casino 99 may offer tournament players a predetermined amount of points that will entitle a player to a prize and/or entry into another tournament. The range of points will be from 5-100. To participate in the points system, players must have a Player's Card (GEGA-004099) with an associated player's number. If a player does not have a player's card, they can sign up for one, free of charge, before the tournament begins. A key employee will track players' points on a log. At a minimum, the log must contain the player's number from the Player's Card, how points were earned, and how many points were earned. Once a player uses points, to earn a prize or to be entered into another tournament, the points used will be deducted on the log. Player can check their total amount of points at any time by asking a casino employee. Points are non-transferrable and will only be valid for specific time purposes.

EXAMPLE: There are twenty-four (24) tournament events held during the Legends of Poker Tournaments at the Casino. Ten (10) of the tournaments will be pre-designated as points tournaments where the players who finish in the top 25 will be awarded a predetermined number of points (depending on which place they finish in) that will accumulate during the month. At the end of the point qualification, the player with the

top number of points could win a car or the top nine (9) winners will be granted a free entry into the \$10,000 main event.

Players can also earn tournament points by playing in a live game. Players can earn a range of 1-100 points for playing in a live game for 15 minutes to 2 hours before or after a tournament. To participate in the points system, players must have a Player's Card with an associated player's number. Players may qualify for prizes ranging in value from \$10-\$25,000, such as cash, chips, merchandise, and trips. Players may also gain entry into a future tournament by utilizing the Points System.

Funding

The Points System will be house funded. No money shall be withheld from the tournament prize pool for the points system.

**During 'bounty' tournaments only, this fee will be collected to fund the bounty prize pool.

***During some tournaments, this fee will be collected to partially fund that event when players pay the buy-in fee. Casino 99 will match the total fee collected. Any money not used to fund the event will go to the winner of the event. The amount charged and the total amount collected will be posted

Tournament Prize Amounts & Source of Funds

The prizes will be the cumulative amount of buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. The prizes may also be guaranteed. The cardroom may provide prizes or add funds to the prize pool for special events.

- When the prize amount is guaranteed, the payouts will be a cash value ranging from \$10-\$5,000. The cash will be paid to players from the buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. If there is not enough cash to cover the guaranteed prize amount, Casino 99 will fund the difference. If the total of the buy-ins plus re-buys and add-ons (if applicable) is greater than the amount guaranteed, the prize pool will be increased by the excess funds.

Tournament Prize Structure

The NPN player must adhere to all rules as the tournament player. All advertisements shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the gaming activities offered during the Poker Tournaments.

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Casino 99 may advertise various names for this gaming activity. Should the Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-001249) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to this gaming activity.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in the Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods
- Qualifying hands and corresponding prize amounts
- Jackpot fee amount and breakdown
- Availability of Alternative Prize Option & corresponding value
- Administrative fees
- Prize Payout structure
- Availability of No Purchase Necessary
- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity

Eligible Controlled Games

The Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot shall be attached to the following Bureau approved controlled games offered at Casino 99, as shown below, at all times that this gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

- Ultimate Texas Hold'em (GEGR-002151)

Object and Summary

The Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot considers the best hand(s) possible among each individual player's cards.

1. To begin each round, players must make their regular base game wager. The players may optionally place any bonus bets along with the optional jackpot fee of \$1. In addition, when a player places the optional \$1 jackpot fee, the player is eligible to win an Envy Bonus Payout.
2. "Hockey Puck" discs shall be attached to the table in front of each betting position. These discs have a sensor and shall detect when a casino chip is placed on them. Players who wish to participate in the jackpot must place the optional jackpot fee on the sensor. The sensor shall then light up.
3. Once all players place their bets and/or jackpot fee, the house dealer shall press "Game Start" on the keypad. The sensors shall then light up, indicating participation in the progressive jackpot. The house dealer shall then remove all jackpot fees from the table. The jackpot fees shall be dropped into a separate and locked jackpot collection box and accounted for separately.
4. The house dealer then follows standard approved procedures for dealing the base game. A player can qualify for the jackpot element of the game regardless of the outcome of the base game.

Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot

Qualifying Hands

Players that make one of the advertised qualifying hands, as shown below, shall be eligible to win their share of the posted prize amount, according to the payout options listed below. All qualifying hands within a chart must be offered together at all times:

*A Community Royal is a hand consisting of an ace, king, queen, jack and 10 of the same suit, all in the community cards.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours posted for the gaming activity.

- A minimum of two players, a player and a player-dealer, are required to play for this gaming activity
- Only seated players, who have paid the optional \$1 jackpot fee and dealt a designated hand, are eligible for payouts (including a Community Royal).
- The Community Royal prize is \$1,000 paid to each player who placed the optional \$1 jackpot fee on that hand and did not use any hole cards to complete the hand.
- Backline bettors are not eligible to place a jackpot collection fee or receive the prize amount for a qualifying hand.
- There is no limit to how many times a player may win a progressive or fixed prize within a promotional period.
- A patron may place a base game wager as well as the optional \$1 jackpot fee on any unoccupied seat, as well as their own, and become eligible for multiple payouts.
- Casino employees are eligible for the Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot when off-duty and out of uniform.
- Tournament games are not eligible for this gaming activity.
- Third-Party Provider of Proposition Player Services (TPPPS) are not eligible to place a jackpot collection fee and become eligible for the Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive jackpot when in either the player-dealer or player capacity.
- The player-dealer position is not eligible for this promotion.

Prize

Fixed Prizes

- All fixed payouts shall be paid by a casino representative. Once the proper paperwork has been filled out, a casino representative shall pay the winner(s) in live casino chips. The fixed payouts shall not be made from the house dealer's tray.
- All fixed jackpot qualifying hands are paid from the reserve fund. They do not get deducted from the amount shown on the meter. In the event the reserve fund is depleted, the casino shall make up any shortfall and will not be reimbursed.

Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot

- In the event more than one qualifying hand hits during the same round, all qualifying hands will be paid the posted fixed amount.

Progressive Prize

- A Royal Flush is paid 100% of the progressive jackpot amount shown on the progressive meter. This is not the same as the Community Royal Flush.
- The winner(s) will be paid in live casino chips by a casino representative once their hand has been verified.

Envy Bonus

- A player paying \$1 jackpot fee also qualifies to win an Envy payout. If another player at the table hits a hand associated with an Envy pay, all other players who paid the \$1 jackpot fee will receive the Envy Bonus. The player hitting the hand receives the normal prize pay only, and does NOT receive the Envy pay.
- In the event that more than one player achieves a hand associated with an Envy pay, all other players will receive multiple Envy payouts. The players who achieved the qualifying hands are only eligible for the normal prize and will not receive the Envy pay.
- If a player's hand triggers an Envy payout, the house dealer shall leave the hand face-up on the layout; otherwise, the house dealer shall lock up the cards. The house dealer shall then move on to the next player.
- All Envy Bonus payouts will be paid by a casino representative at the end of the round. Once the proper paperwork has been filled out, the casino representative will pay the winner(s) in live casino chips. The payouts will not be made from the house dealer's tray. All Envy Bonus payouts will be deducted from the amount in the reserve fund.

Alternative Prize Option

When predetermined, posted, and offered, winners of the jackpot will have the option to claim a prize in the form of merchandise, vehicle, trips, gift certificates, clothing, jewelry, or tournament entries (GEGA-001814) in lieu of the entire posted jackpot prize. The merchandise will be assigned a monetary value that will be less than the actual retail value. The cost assigned will be reimbursed to Casino 99 and any difference will be borne solely by the gambling establishment. Only one item will be offered and it will be up to the winners to decide who will get it. If the players cannot come to an agreement, the cash prize will be awarded as normal.

Example: A Vespa scooter that cost \$2,381 will be displayed in the gambling establishment with an assigned value of \$2,000. In this example, a player wins a jackpot with a posted prize of \$5,000. They will have the option of taking all of the posted prize or taking \$3,000 and the scooter which will total \$5,000. The Casino will be reimbursed (from the jackpot prize pool) only \$2,000 and they will expense the remainder (\$381) within their bookkeeping. The rest of the jackpot prize will be awarded as normal.

- Once a winner is determined, the chosen player must decide how they will claim their jackpot prize.
 - Either the original prize or a combination of the original prize and the posted alternative prize.
- One Alternative Prize Option (when offered) will be available per jackpot.
- All eligibility and prizes will be predetermined and posted.

Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot

Funding

The Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot is player funded with both fixed and progressive elements. The Casino shall initially seed the jackpot in an amount between \$1,000 and \$2,000. Once there are sufficient monies in the Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot reserve fund, the initial seed shall be reimbursed to the Casino and shall be documented in the accounting records. After the progressive jackpot is hit, it shall be reseeded by the reserve fund in an amount between \$1,000 and \$50,000. If there are not sufficient monies in the reserve fund, the Casino will cover any shortfall and shall not be reimbursed. The progressive prize pool shall increase daily based solely on the number of jackpot collection fees placed and collected each day. All increases and decreases to the Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot reserve fund shall be documented in the accounting records. Furthermore, there is no cap on this progressive prize pool.

Each \$1.00 jackpot fee paid by a player shall be broken down as follows:

- \$0.30 shall be immediately posted on the meter.
- \$0.70 shall be tracked in a reserve fund.

Administrative Fees

The Casino shall take an administrative fee of \$5 - \$15 per table per hour. The administrative fee shall be taken from the reserve fund. The fee shall cover the costs associated with maintaining and servicing the computer system and program.

No Purchase Necessary

The Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with **no restrictions**. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.

Equipment

The electronic software and digital reader related to and used in conjunction with this jackpot, which is used on each table eligible for this jackpot, has been tested, approved, and certified by the Gaming Laboratories International, LLC (GLI).

1. When a player has a progressive winner, the dealer shall press the appropriate hand button on the keypad.
2. The house dealer shall then contact a casino representative.
3. Once the casino verifies the progressive win, a casino representative will press "Confirm", then swipe the authorization card. This records the win onto the Game Manager. House procedures are then followed for paying the prize.
4. When the house dealer reconciles all action (on behalf of the player/dealer), the house dealer presses "Game Over." This resets the system to begin the next hand.
5. Once the "Confirm" button is pressed, the prize is logged into Game Manager.
6. If the electronic software or digital reader malfunctions or breaks down, the jackpot will not be offered.
