THE DIVISION OF MEDI-CAL FRAUD AND ELDER ABUSE

The Division of Medi-Cal Fraud and Elder Abuse (DMFEA) investigates and prosecutes medical providers who defraud the Medi-Cal program. These providers include, but are not limited to: nursing homes, hospice companies, unlicensed care facilities, doctors, dentists, in-home support service providers, and pharmacies. DMFEA also investigates and prosecutes the abuse or neglect of any Medi-Cal beneficiary when the abuse or neglect is connected with the provision of care. Examples include nursing home residents, residents of unlicensed board and care facilities, dependent adults in healthcare facilities, residential homes, and community based service programs.

COMMON REFERRAL TYPES

Unlicensed Board and Care Facilities

- Residential dwellings that provide minimal care to residents who require assistance with activities of daily living
- Typical source of many calls for service

Elder & Dependent Adult Abuse

- Physical Abuse
- ► Financial Schemes/Scams
- Neglect/Abuse in Nursing Facilities
- Neglect/Abuse by In-Home Support Services Providers

Healthcare Fraud

- ► Prescription Drug Fraud Rings
- Doctors overprescribing or charging cash for prescription opioids
- ▶ Pill Mills
- ► Hospice Fraud (Identity theft or billing for services not rendered)
- ► In-Home Support Services Fraud (billing for services not rendered)
