- Tickets will be drawn with the winning name announced over the public address system. Tickets will be drawn until a winner is found; must be present to win.
- 4. Winner must provide valid photo identification and complete the winner information form. Winners will be responsible for all tax obligations associated with the prize.
- 5. After the "10 days of Christmas" drawing, the drawing tickets will be removed from the drum and placed into the "Lucky Money" Monday night cash give away drum. All patrons submitting tickets for the "10 days of Christmas" promotion will also be eligible for the Monday night drawings.
- 6. Tickets will be awarded for the following hands:

Jacks full house or better
Jacks full house or better
Aces full house or better
Straight or Flush with a joker
Any hand w/ a general in the back
Any 9 (nine) in the first 3 cards

7. No Purchase Necessary. Patrons wishing to participate in the "10 days of Christmas" promotion without playing in a designated game or paying a collection fee may obtain drawing tickets at a designated location. Players may receive a ticket once every two (2) hours, similar in odds to that of a patron playing non-stop in a qualifying game. In addition, patrons wishing to participate by playing in a designated game but without paying a collection fee may request to play at a promotional table where hands are dealt in normal fashion, but no wagers are made and no collection fees taken.

A pre- designated fixed prize that ranges from \$20-\$5000. The pre-designated prize will be displayed visibly at a conspicuous location or locations. Different fixed prizes may be used for different limit/type of Texas Hold'em games.

Fixed prizes.

The "Cracked Hand" promotion is a attached to the Poker Jackpot promotion and thereby is player funded through the same \$1.00 collection fee(s). No additional collection is taken to fund the "Cracked Hand" promotion.

A \$1.00 Jackpot collection will be taken from the total collection fees paid to the House during each round of play and a second \$1.00 Jackpot collection will be taken when the pot reaches \$20. Object and Summary

- 1. To begin each round, players must place a base game wager in order to qualify for the jackpot. Along with any bonus bets the player places a wager on, player(s) have the option to place a \$1.00 jackpot fee and become eligible for the jackpot.
- 2. "Hockey Puck" discs will be attached to the table in front of each betting position. These discs have a sensor and will detect when a casino chip is placed on them. Players must place the optional jackpot fee on the sensor. The sensor will then light up.
- 3. Once all players place their controlled game wagers and jackpot fees, the house dealer will press "Start Game" on the keypad. The sensors will then light up, indicating participation in the progressive gaming activity. The house dealer will then remove all jackpot fees from the table. Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the pre-determined specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- The Third Party Provider of Proposition Player Services is not eligible for this promotion.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate in this gaming activity when they are off duty and out of uniform.
- There is a minimum of two (2) players required to be dealt into the game to qualify; a player and a player-dealer (may be a Third Party Proposition Player).
- A minimum of three (3) decks of cards must be played with at all times that this gaming activity is being offered.
- A player can gualify for the jackpot element of the game regardless of the outcome of the controlled game.
- Only seated players are eligible for payouts, backline bettors are not eligible for this • promotion.

Prize

All monies collected and paid out shall be tracked both electronically and on a hand written log that shall be maintained by the gambling enterprise, for examination by regulatory and law enforcement personnel.

- a. Three seven's of the same suit is paid 100% of the progressive jackpot amount shown on the progressive meter.
- b. All other hands are paid a fixed amount from the reserve fund. They do not get deducted from the amount shown on the meter. In the event the reserve fund is depleted, the casino will make up any shortfall. Once there are sufficient monies in the Blazing Sevens Progressive Jackpot fund, the shortfall amount will be reimbursed to the Casino and shall be documented in the accounting records.
- c. In the event more than one progressive meter pay or any other qualifying hand hits during the same round, all winning players will share, in equal amounts, the posted progressive prize or the posted fixed amount. In the event the reserve fund is depleted, the casino will make up any shortfall. All hands will be paid the posted prize.
- d. When a player has a progressive winning hand, the dealer shall press the appropriate hand button on the keypad.
- e. The house dealer shall then contact a supervisor.

The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for all patrons who request to participate in the gaming activity without paying a table fee or placing a live wager. <u>All advertisement material shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Blazing Sevens Progressive Jackpot. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, and flyers.</u>

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for California Games Tournaments, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Lucky Chances Casino at all times that a California Games Tournament is offered for play:

- How a player may enter the tournament.
- The game(s) that will be offered during the play of the tournament.
- The fees that will be charged for entering the tournament, including a description for each fee charged and whether it shall be retained by the Lucky Chances Casino, added directly into the tournament prize pool, or any other method of retention or distribution.

Prizes are fixed amounts from \$10 - \$1,000,000 as stated in Table 1 above. Each prize amount and qualifying hand will be prominently displayed on the casino floor and in brochures.

Player funded through collection fees.

A \$2.00 Jackpot collection will be taken from the total collection fees paid to the House during each round of play. The Jackpot collections will be added to the Jackpot fund.

The Double Hand Jackpot promotion will be combined with the Super Poker Jackpot Promotion and is therefore already seeded. Prizes will be awarded in gaming chips to customers obtaining a designated jackpot hand at a Double Hand Jackpot table. Jackpot prizes will be split equally among all players wagering on that spot and paying a collection fee.

The player(s) with the qualifying hand wins 100% of the posted prize for that hand. If there are multiple players wagering on the qualifying hand, then the jackpot prize is split equally among all qualified players.

- 1. Fortune Pai Gow Poker Progressive adds a progressive jackpot element to the game of Fortune Pai Gow Poker.
- 2. Fortune Pai Gow Poker progressive considers the best hand possible among each individual player's cards. In order to determine whether a player qualifies for either a progressive or a fixed prize payout, all seven cards dealt to the player's hand are taken into account. It shall not be based on how the player arranges their five card back hand and their two card front hand for the game of Fortune Pai Gow Poker. In the event that the seven cards dealt to the player make a qualifying hand, that player shall be eligible to win either a progressive or fixed prize payout. Additionally, a player qualifies for the jackpot element of the game regardless of the outcome of the base game. Also, a player is eligible for the jackpot whether they are in the player-dealer position or simply a player.
- 3. To begin each round, players must make their regular base game wager. They may optionally place the jackpot fee, which may only be in the amount of \$1.00, which will allow them to be eligible for the Fortune Pai Gow Progressive. - j. Once the casino verifies the progressive win, the floor person shall insert the key and rotate it to "JPH" and then press "J-pot" button. This records the win onto the Game Manager. House procedures are then followed for paying the prize.
- k. Returning the key to the "Run" position will restore normal operation of the table, and adjust the meter appropriately for the prize won.
- I. When the house dealer reconciles all action (on behalf of the player/dealer), he/she presses "Game Over." This resets the system to begin the next hand.
- m. Once the "J-pot" button is pressed, the prize is logged into Game Manager.

8. All monies collected and paid out shall be tracked electronically and maintained by the gambling enterprise, for examination by regulatory and law enforcement personnel.

- 9. All fixed payouts will be paid by a Casino floor person. Once the proper paperwork has been filled out, the floor person will pay the winner(s) in casino chips. The payouts will not be made from the Casino dealer's tray. All fixed payouts will be deducted from the amount in the reserve fund, not the posted progressive prize.
- 10. The Casino will initially seed the jackpot with an amount ranging between \$1,000 and \$10,000. Once there are sufficient monies in the Fortune Pai Gow Poker jackpot reserve fund, the initial seed will be reimbursed to the Casino and shall be documented in the accounting records. When a 7 Card Straight flush hand is made and 100% of progressive jackpot prize is awarded, the posted progressive prize will be re-seeded by the reserve fund with an amount ranging between \$1,000 and \$10,000. The progressive prize will have no cap and will continue to progress until won.
- 11. A digital meter shall be attached to each eligible table, which shall display the available progressive prize. The jackpot collection fees shall be calculated and a >portion= shall be displayed on the >real time= monitor. For each optional \$1 jackpot collection fee placed and collected, the following breakdown shall occur:
 - a. \$0.15 will be immediately posted on the electronic meter.
 - b. \$0.80 will be tracked in a reserve fund. The reserve fund will be utilized to immediately reseed the metered progressive jackpot prize in an amount ranging between \$1,000 and \$10,000. In addition this reserve fund will payout all fixed amounts.



c. \$0.05 will be retained by the Casino as an administrative fee.

Therefore, the 'portion' that shall be displayed on the 'real time' monitor shall be \$0.15 of each \$1.00 jackpot collection fee placed and collected.

- 12. Seated players as well as backline betters are eligible to place a jackpot collection fee and be eligible for the jackpot. In the event that a seated player makes a qualifying hand, and the seated player and the backline bettor(s) places a jackpot collection fee, each player wagering on that hand shall receive 100% of posted jackpot prize for that qualifying hand, except in the instance that the qualifying hand is a 7 Card Straight Flush. In this instance, all players wagering on that hand shall equally split the posted progressive prize amount.
- 13. Third Party of Proposition Player Services (TPPPPS) is eligible to participate in the Fortune Pai Gow Poker Progressive in either the player or player-dealer capacity so long as they have placed the jackpot collection fee.
- 14. Any person wishing to participate in the Fortune Pai Gow Poker Progressive jackpot on a "No Purchase Necessary" (NPN) basis may do so. The assigned floor person will open a Fortune Pai Gow Poker table where the NPN participant will play in a simulated game on a general and indiscriminate basis with no restrictions. There will be no live wagers or monies used on the NPN table. All game rules for the live game will be adhered too.

15. The prize distribution is as follows:

If a hand contains a joker, the hand is eligible for the jackpot regardless of which jackpot hand it is. Additionally, the joker may only be used as an ace or to complete a straight, flush, or straight flush.

Object and Summary

The Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot features a progressive jackpot prize, which is awarded to players participating in an eligible controlled game when a designated second hand is beaten by a better qualifying hand at the showdown. When the winning and losing hands are confirmed, those players with the qualifying jackpot hands shall receive the posted percentage of the progressive jackpot prize. Additionally, a posted percentage of the jackpot prize, known as the table share, shall be evenly distributed amongst all other players at the qualifying table who have participated in the designated game, as shown below.

Qualifying Hands

Players that make one of the following advertised winning or losing qualifying hands during the play of an eligible poker game shall be eligible to win their share of the Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot prize amount. Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at an above listed controlled game during the pre-determined and specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

Funding

The Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot is funded from a \$1 collection fee taken during all eligible games from the total collection fees taken during each round of play. Additionally, an extra \$1 collection fee will be taken for the jackpot when the pot reaches \$20 or more. The Poker Jackpot prize pool will be increased daily at pre-determined and designated times with an amount ranging from \$50-\$5,000. When a qualifying jackpot hand is made, it will be-reseeded with an amount ranging from \$1,000-\$200,000 from the reserve fund. The prize pool may be capped at an amount, according to the chart below. Under no circumstance will the cap be decreased once it has been set and posted. The cap shall remain the same until the jackpot has been hit. Once the maximum cap amount has been reached, all collection fees taken will be placed into a reserve account. The reserve account will be uncapped.

Administrative Fees

The Lucky Chances Casino will retain an administrative fee ranging from \$2-\$6 per table hour. The administrative fee will be taken from the reserve fund, and not from the amount posted to

the players. The administrative fee may be adjusted within the above approved range based on market factors and the cost of operating this gaming activity.

No Purchase Necessary

Patrons may participate in Lucky Chances' Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot gaming activity at **any** time and without paying a collection or a fee. The Poker Shift Supervisor or Operations Shift Manager or designated employee will take a patron expressing a desire to "play" for the jackpot to an empty gaming table. If there are no empty tables, one will be provided with in a reasonable amount of time. The Poker Coordinator, Operations Shift Manager, or designated employee will then shuffle a deck of cards and deal out nine (9) poker hands as would be the case in a full, live poker game. The patron will be instructed to choose a hand from the nine (9) on the table. Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in the Lucky Chances Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods.
- Coupon and/or free play chip coupon(s).
- Procedures to redeem coupons or free play chips.
- Any other applicable restrictions.
- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity.

Eligible Controlled Games

The Match Play Promotion shall be attached to all Bureau approved California games offered at the Lucky Chances Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

Patrons are awarded Match Play or Free Play Coupons via advertisements in magazines, websites, mailing advertisements, winning a Bureau approved promotion, winning or signing up for a Bureau approved tournament, etc. Players who receive a Match Play or Free Play Coupon will be eligible to win the specific amount printed on the coupon if he or she places a wager on an eligible game equal to the amount listed on the coupon.

Match Play Coupon

- Lucky Chances Casino will offer Match Play Coupons having a face value of \$5 to \$500 per coupon. The amount will be clearly stated on the coupon. Each coupon will state the specific qualifying game(s) that the voucher may be used on.
- The player must place the Match Play Coupon on the table and must place a wager equal to the amount of the Match Play Coupon.
- When the player uses a Match Play coupon and the hand wins, the player will be paid for the total wager (live chip(s) plus the Match Play Coupon value) and the used Match Play Coupon is collected and voided.
- When the player uses a Match Play Coupon and the hand loses, the player will only lose his or her original wager and the used Match Play Coupon is collected and voided as well. Free Play Chip

- The Casino will offer Free Play Chips having a face value from \$5.00 to \$500.00 per chip. The Free Play Chips are used in live games exactly like regular chips, the difference being that they cannot be exchanged for cash.
- The Free Play Chips shall initially be in the form of a coupon which shall be offered to all patrons that wish to come into the Casino and use them to play.

When the winning and losing hands are confirmed, those players with the qualifying jackpot hands shall receive the posted fixed jackpot prize payout structure. Additionally, a posted percentage of the jackpot prize, known as the table share, shall be evenly distributed amongst all the other players at the qualifying table who have participated in the designated game, as shown below.

Qualifying Hands

Players that make one of the following advertised winning or losing qualifying hands during the play of an eligible poker game shall be eligible to win their share of the Mini Poker Jackpot prize amount. Only winning and losing hands that have been Bureau approved and pre-determined and designated by the Casino are eligible. In order to qualify for the jackpot both winning and losing hands must use two hole cards, when applicable.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at an above listed controlled game during the pre-determined and specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- Players with qualifying winning and losing hands must play through the final betting round in order to qualify for the jackpot. If a player with one of the qualifying hands folds prior to the final betting round, the table will be in-eligible for the jackpot.
- When a qualifying hand is announced, a floor person shall verify that both hands qualify. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the jackpot.
- Four or more players are required to be dealt in during an eligible game in order for players to be eligible and the tables to qualify for the Mini Poker Jackpot prize amount and table share percentage, as well as for a jackpot collection to be dropped. If there are three or less players dealt in during an eligible game, the table shall be in-eligible for the Mini Poker Jackpot and the jackpot collection shall not be dropped.

Prize

Funding

The Mini Poker Jackpot gaming activity will be funded from the reserve fund for the Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot (GEGA-000766). In all instances, patrons will be provided with ample advanced notice of the prize amounts.

Administrative Fees

The Lucky Chances Casino will not retain an administrative fee for this jackpot, other than what is already taken for the Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot.

No Purchase Necessary

Patrons may participate in Lucky Chances' Mini Poker Jackpot gaming activity at **any** time and without paying a collection or a fee. The Poker Shift Supervisor or Operations Shift Manager or designated employee will take a patron expressing a desire to "play" for the jackpot to an empty gaming table. If there are no empty tables, one will be provided with in a reasonable amount of time. The Poker Shift Supervisor, Operations Shift Manager, or designated employee will then shuffle a deck of cards and deal out the correct number of poker hands as would be the case in a full, live poker game. The patron will be instructed to choose a hand from the hands on the table. The Poker Shift Supervisor, Operations Shift Manager, or designated employee will then follow the dealing procedures for the specific game. The rest of the hands will then be turned face up. Should any two hands constitute a "jackpot" as set forth in these rules, the patron will receive the appropriate share, as explained in these rules. The patron would also be eligible for any other Jackpot promotions that were ongoing for that time of day. There is no limit to the number of hands a patron may ask for.

Lucky Chances would like to add a Gaming Activity to our Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot promotion (GEGA-000766), to include a "Players Club" reward program:

Summary 54

With approval, a "Players Club" will be created for all Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot games. Players may earn points for time played in Poker Jackpot games. These points can be used for any item that has a cash value such as food, gift shop, tournaments, "Cash Back" etc.

Funding

The funding of the Players Club will come from the Poker Jackpot account. A separate liability account will be created to segregate Players Club points earned to the general fund consisting of existing Bad Beat jackpots and Jackpot promotions. This Players Club liability account will be used for redemption of points. Points earned will added to the Players Club account. The Lucky Chances Casino shall cover all shortfalls should the Poker Jackpot reserve fund not have sufficient funds to cover all player redemptions.

Earning of Points

Players will have to sign up to the "Players Club" in order to earn points. Point value be equal \$0.01 per point (100 points equal \$1). For each hour played in a Jackpot game, players can earn 50 to 200 points per hour. The amount a player can earn will be clearly posted throughout the Casino for terms, games and points earned. Points earned will be credited to the account of issued holder and are not transferable to another player. Fractions of hours are calculated by amount of hours and minutes played; for example, at 50 points earned per hour of play, a player that plays for one hour and 12 minutes will earn 60 points. Players shall earn approximately .833333 points per minute played, with fractional points rounded down.

The process of earning points will be as follows:

- 1. Players swipe in when in the Poker room to sign up for a game
- 2. When a player enters a Jackpot Poker game, they will be assigned to a table and time started to earn points.
- 3. When a player is finished playing in a Jackpot Poker game, their time will be stopped
- 4. Hourly checks will be made by Poker staff for all active, qualified players.

Redemption of Points

Accumulated points earned by qualified players can be used in any sales outlet at Lucky Chances for the valued earned to the price charged. Players must produce valid identification at the time of redemption to ensure proper dispensing of points. The following are examples of point redemption value:

Example:

- 1. Player orders a meal for \$8.99. 899 points will be deducted from their "Players Club" account.
- 2. Player wants to enter a tournament with a buy in of \$60. 6,000 points will be deducted from their "Players Club" account.

In the event that a player does not have the full amount of points for the item purchased, they may use their available points and combination of cash.

A "Cash Back" option will also be made available for 50% of point value. If a player wishes to utilize the "Cash Back" option, they will receive 50% value to points accumulated. Example: Player has a balance of 100,000 points with a redemption value of \$1,000.00; they may receive "Cash Back" for \$500. The remaining \$500.00 will be reallocated to the Jackpot general fund. The process of redeeming points will be as follows:

- 1. Players swipe in at a kiosk and enter the amount of points they wish to redeem
- 2. A redemption slip on the amount requested will be issued to the player
- 3. The redemption slip will be used at sales outlets in lieu of cash or in combination with cash
- 4. The minimum value for redemption per calendar day shall be \$5.00 and the maximum shall be \$100.00.

Points may not be given in the form of tips or gratuities.

Expiration of Points

Inactive accounts for 6 months or longer will be closed. Points earned from closed accounts will be reallocated to the general Jackpot fund. Inactive closed accounts may be reopened as a new account with no balance. The terms of expired accounts will be clearly posted in all "Players Club" written material including posters, pamphlets and website.

Player's Club Bar-Code and Ameranth System Description

The Player's Club bar-code sticker shall include a bar-code and player number unique to each player in the Ameranth System. The Player's Club bar-code sticker that may be affixed to whatever the player chooses. The Player's Club bar-code sticker may be affixed to whatever item the player chooses. Player's are required to show valid government issued, photo identification in order to sign-up to receive a Player's Club bar-code sticker. Players may sign up at one of the available kiosks throughout the casino. Examples of these items include, ID card, business card, wallet, etc. Descriptive language regarding restrictions and eligibility shall be conspicuously posted around the casino floor and shall be made available to all patrons.

- The card shall be non-transferable.
- Lost or damaged cards shall be replaced.
- Player information shall be maintained in a secure database accessed only by casino management. Access to the database shall also be tracked by casino management.
- Players are tracked by having the casino staff scan their bar-code when they sit down to start playing. They remain in the system accruing time until the player leaves the game and is checked out casino staff.

- Only the network administrator(s) has access to the back-end systems where the data is stored. Access to the data is by user level with multiple levels based on what the user will be doing. Managers can edit time (i.e. if the player forgot to have their card swiped and need time added), floor persons can log players into the system if the player forgot their card, dealers can only see who is playing at their table and can check them in and out and mark them temporarily away from the table. The manager will have access to customer data for marketing purposes (i.e. emails, texts, mass mailing, etc.)
- Data is backed up on a daily basis by ArcServe software and Quantum hardware.
- A printable record of the amount of time a player has accumulated during the period of time that the gaming activity is being offered, shall be available at anytime their request.

<u>Eligibility</u>

- Tournament games, as well as live games, shall be eligible for this promotion.
- In tournament games, players shall be awarded a fixed amount of points per tournament entry of between 50-500 points. This amount is dependant on the tournament buy-in amount. Point value of each tournament entry shall be clearly posted.
- Third Party Proposition players are eligible to win a prize in this promotion since they will not be participating in the player-dealer position.
- Casino employees are eligible to win a prize in this promotion when they are off duty. If playing while still in uniform, the uniform must be covered.
- Patrons shall be given ample notice of how many points shall be awarded, as well as, the amount of time required to earn points for each eligible game.

No Purchase Necessary

Players may participate in Lucky Chances "Players Club" without paying a collection fee by requesting to participate for free. They will be issued 50 points per request per calendar day.

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

The Lucky Chances Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. <u>Should the</u> <u>Lucky Chances Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEGA-000530) shall be</u> referenced on all advertisements relating to the Poker Tournaments.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for Poker Tournaments, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in the Lucky Chances Casino at all times that a Poker Tournament is offered for play:

- How a player may enter the tournament.
- The game(s) that will be offered during the play of the tournament.
- The fees that will be charged for entering the tournament, including a description for each fee charged and whether it shall be retained by the Lucky Chances Casino, added directly into the tournament prize pool, or any other method of retention or distribution.
- The amount of tournament chips that will be awarded to each player upon entry into the tournament.
- The tournament prize structure that will be offered and the number of players that will be paid.
- When the patron(s) will be paid and the manner in which they will be paid.
- Any other restrictions that apply to the Poker Tournament.
- The amount that shall be withheld from the buy-ins to fund free roll tournaments.

Tournament Log

For each tournament conducted a Tournament Log must be completed. The Lucky Chances Casino shall maintain all completed tournament logs for at least seven years. These logs shall be maintained in either paper or electronic format. The cardroom shall also retain and make available the most recent three months of the tournament logs for inspection by a representative of the Bureau during all hours of operation.  - Total number of prizes awarded

- Total amount deducted from prize pool (when applicable)
- Results of the tournament, including the amount paid out and amount paid for each place in the tournament
- Signature of casino staff responsible for administering the tournament

Gaming Activities Offered During Tournament Play

Bounties

Bounty targets are tournament players who are selected prior to the start of the tournament. During the play of a tournament, either a single player or multiple players in a tournament may be designated as bounty targets. If a bounty target player loses all of their tournament chips during a hand of play and is eliminated from the tournament, the winner of that hand shall win a pre-determined and designated amount of money ranging in value between \$10 and \$5,000. The bounty prize will by funded by Lucky Chances Casino, not from the tournament prize pool.

<u>Tokens</u>

Object and Summary

At the beginning of a tournament, Lucky Chances Casino may provide one token to all players participating. When a player goes "all-in", their token goes into the pot and whoever wins the pot shall also win the token. During certain times throughout the tournament, the tokens are redeemed for a prize.

Eligibility Requirements

• Casino employees are eligible when off duty. Third Party Proposition Players are not eligible to participate in Poker Tournaments.

Prize

Players may redeem the tokens for a cash prize ranging in value from \$5-\$100 for each token.

Funding

The Tokens will be house funded, not from the tournament prize pool.

Points System

Object and Summary

During a specified and predetermined time period, Lucky Chances Casino may offer tournament players a predetermined amount of points that will entitle a player to a prize and/or entry into a freeroll tournament. The range of points will be from 10-100. Points are non-transferrable and will only be valid for specific time purposes.

Eligibility Requirements

 Casino employees are eligible when off duty. Third Party Proposition Players are not eligible to participate in Poker Tournaments.

Prize

Players may qualify for prizes ranging in value from \$100-\$25,000, such as cash, chips, merchandise, and trips. Players may also gain entry into a future tournament by utilizing the Points System.

Funding

The Points System will be house funded.

Tournament Variations

Freeroll Tournament

- It shall be predetermined and posted when a freeroll tournament shall be offered.
- Entry is gained via Bureau approved promotions earned during specified tournament play. This shall be displayed prior to the start of any qualifying tournament.
- The freeroll tournament prize pool is funded by an amount ranging from \$1-\$1,000, which is taken from the buy-in for each tournament
- The house may add extra funds to the existing freeroll tournament prize pool to increase the amount.

Employee Only Tournaments

- Employee Only Tournaments are events where any employee may sign up to play. The tournament is open to all current Lucky Chances employees.
- It shall be predetermine and posted when a employee only tournament shall be offered.
- There will usually be two separate sessions to accommodate a 24-hour schedule. Each session plays down to 5 players, who will all return for a final table event at a later date.
- The prize structure will consist of a fixed number of prizes and amounts determined by management. Lucky Chances provides the prize money, which is recorded for payroll purposes.
- Just as in a regular tournament, the final table may make a decision to split the prize money instead of playing down to the finish.

Tournament Entry

- Tournament entry is open to all customers.
- The specific structure shall be on any and all advertisements and must be made available to patrons prior to the start of the tournament. The structure of a tournament shall not change once sign-ups begin.
- Promotional materials shall not advertise gender-based discounts nor imply a gender-based entrance policy.

- Entry may be earned by winning a previous tournament or winning their entry from a promotion at the casino. Any employee may enter an "employee only" event at no cost to the employee. All gaming activities and/or promotions shall be approved by the Bureau prior to being offered for play.
- More than one method of entry may be utilized for specified tournaments.

*\$1-\$1,000 from every buy-in shall be placed into a prize pool to fund free roll tournaments.

**The entry fee shall be retained by the Lucky Chances Casino to run the tournament, pay its Casino staff, and fund other Tournament events or prizes. This fee shall not be included in the tournament prize pool.

***The Staff Appreciation Add-on is used to pay the tournament staff and dealers. This is an optional fee that tournament entrants can pay in exchange for tournament chips. This fee shall not be included in the tournament prize pool, and is not income for the Lucky Chances Casino.

Tournament Prize Amounts & Source of Funds

The prizes will be the cumulative amount of buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. The prizes may also be guaranteed. The cardroom may provide prizes or add funds to the prize pool for special events.

- When the prize amount is guaranteed, the payouts will be a cash value ranging from \$100 \$1,000,000. The cash will be paid to players from the buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons. If there is not enough cash to cover the guaranteed prize amount, Lucky Chances Casino will fund the difference.
- When the prize pool is not based solely on buy-ins, re-buys, and add-ons (free roll) Lucky Chances Casino will determine and set the payout structure.

Tournament Prize Structure

When the prize is not guaranteed, the prize structure will be broken down by the number of paid entries and percentage paid. The percentage paid out will always equal 100%. In the event the players decide to forgo the payout structure and "split" the total prize pool among them, it shall be permitted and shall be noted in detail on the casino's tournament log. All active players must agree on how the prize pool will be split.

Additional Prizes

Promotional prizes may consist of automobiles, watercraft, cruises, jewelry, precious metals, apparel items, electronics, card protectors, chipsets, or other items of value. These prizes are funded by Lucky Chances and not from the tournament prize pool. Promotional prizes are included as optional prizes for tournament winners or high point winners during a tournament series.

Other prizes may consist of entry into other established tournament events, such as the World Series of Poker Tournament (WSOP), World Poker Tour, Heartland Poker Tour (HPT), or entry into other Lucky Chances' Tournaments. Play stops when the number of players remaining matches the number of tournament seat packages offered.

Entities Involved Other than the House

At any time, Lucky Chances Casino may offer a charity tournament that would include other organizations. These organizations shall be reputable and federally recognized as non-profit or charity organizations. Charity tournament prize structures and prizes will be determined by the non-profit organization sponsoring the event and will be published prior to and at the tournament event. Lucky Chances Casino may donate prizes such as entries into Lucky Chances to the charity.

No Purchase Necessary

The gaming activities attached to the Poker Tournaments shall be offered for free, on a general and indiscriminant basis, with no restrictions, to patrons who wish to participate in a No Purchase Necessary (NPN) game. The Casino shall provide No Purchase Necessary tables for patrons who request to participate in the gaming activities attached to the Poker Tournaments without paying any entry into the tournament. The NPN player must adhere to all rules as the tournament player. All advertisements shall state "No Purchase Necessary" when referencing the gaming activities offered during the Poker Tournaments.

Bureau Advertising Requirements

The Lucky Chances Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. <u>Should the</u> Lucky Chances Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEGA-000619) shall be referenced on all advertisements relating to the Rack Attack Promotion.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for this gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be and prominently displayed in The Lucky Chances Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered:

- Eligible controlled games and time of drawings.
- Corresponding eligible games.
- Lucky Chances Casino's procedures and requirements for drawing tickets and prize distribution.
- The value of and types of possible prizes.
- Availability of No Purchase Necessary.
- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity.

Eligible Controlled Games

The Rack Attack Promotion shall be attached to all approved Poker games offered at The Lucky Chances Casino at all times that this gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

Rules of Play

The Rack Attack Promotion features a promotional element which shall be attached to all Poker games currently approved at the Casino. The Rack Attack Promotion involves a drawing drum with specially marked ping pong balls that are numbered with the table numbers. During predetermined times and intervals of the promotional period, a casino employee shall announce the commencement of the drawing. The casino employee shall then select an eligible table by randomly choosing a ping pong ball from the drum. Each ping pong ball shall depict a number that corresponds to an eligible poker table. The ping pong balls, which are equally sized and colored, shall be mixed within the drum. Then, one shall be selected. Once that table number is determined, the employee shall place the pre-determined and posted prize into the pot on the table, at the start of the next hand. Players must have been dealt into the previous hand in order to qualify for the promotion. Betting procedures and play shall proceed as a normal round of play with the following exceptions: the betting structure for the promotional hand for No Limit Texas Hold'em and Pot Limit Omaha will be changed to limit betting rounds and all games will be restricted to one bet and three raises for the betting rounds. The player with the winning hand shall win the pot, including the added prize amount. In the event of a tie, the winning players shall split the pot evenly.

Eligibility Requirements

- A player is eligible to win this promotion by winning the round of poker at the table number that is designated by the drawing.
- The round of play will continue until a winner is determined.
- In the event that two or more players tie a winning hand, the rack shall be evenly distributed between each tying player.

- A minimum of two players must be dealt into the game in order for the table to qualify for the promotion. The maximum is dependent on the amount of seats at the table.
- Casino employees are eligible to participate in the promotion while off duty and out of uniform.
- Players and tables receiving this promotion shall still be eligible for other promotions.
- Tournament games do not qualify for the promotion.
- Players must have been dealt in the previous hand in order to qualify for the promotion.
- A player can not have missed the blind in the previous hand in order to qualify for the promotion.
- In the event that a game is being played with a Hi/Lo split, the prize will be split between the winners of the high hand and low hand.

<u>Prize</u>

When a table is selected, the prize amount shall be added to the pot of that table. The prize shall be a fixed amount ranging from \$100 to a maximum of \$1000 in the form of casino chips. All prizes for this promotion shall be pre-determined and posted in advance, throughout the gaming floor and in all literature promoting such an event.

Funding

The Rack Attack Promotion is funded by the Lucky Chances Poker Jackpot Promotion (GEGA-000766). Therefore, there shall be no additional jackpot fees or collection fees taken for this promotion. All fee collections and table limits are for the designated base games and are Bureau approved, pre-determined and posted at each table.

Administrative Fees

The Lucky Chances Casino shall not retain any additional administrative fees other than those already approved under the Poker Jackpot promotion (GEGA-000766).

No Purchase Necessary Requirement

In the event a player wanted to exercise their "no purchase necessary option", the rule would be as follows: a casino employee will set up a table solely for the NPN player. When the drawing is conducted, and if the NPN players table is drawn, during the next round of play, the casino dealer will deal hands out to all spots at the table. If the NPN player wins that hand, they will be considered the winner of the Rack Attack prize. <u>All advertisement material shall state "No</u> <u>Purchase Necessary" when referencing the Rack Attack Promotion. This requirement extends to all forms of advertising, including electronic message boards, computer monitors, posters, flyers, etc.</u>

Texas Holdem, Omaha, 7-Card Stud, 7-Card Stud Hi-Low

3. Describe any jackpot or any other type of prize awarded.

The "Royal Flush Give-Away" prize(s) will be as follows*:

A fixed prize with the prize amount ranging between \$20 to \$10,000, which will be prominently displayed on the casino floor for each suit [In a standard fifty-two (52) card playing deck there are four (4) suits, *Spades, Hearts, Diamonds,* and *Clubs.* One (1) royal flush is possible per suit. There will be one (1) prize for each royal flush for a total of four (4). Any patron with a qualifying royal flush will win the prize in the corresponding suit.] Only one hole card must play to qualify in Texas Hold'em.

Additionally, a fixed prize in the form of a tournament entry may be awarded. Prize may include a cash prize in addition to the tournament entry. When this option is offered to patrons, they will have the choice of taking the prize in Option A (or Option B, whichever is currently offered) instead; i.e. the choice of the tournament entry or the cash prize.

5. Explain if the gaming activity is house funded or player funded.

The "Royal Flush Give-Away" promotion is attached to the Poker Jackpot* promotion and thereby is player funded through the same collection fees. No additional collection is taken to fund the "Royal Flush Give-Away" promotion.

A \$1.00 Jackpot collection will be taken from the total collection fees paid to the House during each round of play and a second \$1.00 Jackpot collection will be

taken when the pot reaches \$20. The Jackpot collections will be added to the Jackpot fund, which also funds the "Royal Flush Give-Away" promotion.

7. Describe how the jackpot will be seeded and how any prizes will be awarded.

Since this is a modification to the current Poker Jackpot promotion, the fund is already seeded. Prizes are awarded to players in gaming chips and/or tournament entry ticket.

Prize is given to the player holding the designated "Royal Flush" hand.

9. Explain any re-seeding of the fund once the prize is won.

Should the jackpot funds be depleted due to prizes won, the Casino will re-seed the amount between \$1000 to \$100,000.

The minimum number of players needed for the table to be eligible for a Jackpot game is as follows: for Hold'em and Omaha High/Low, five (5) players; for Seven Card Stud and High/Low four (4) players.

Although the Bureau has approved this jackpot modification, jackpots with an electronic component are currently under Bureau review. The Bureau reserves the right to: (1) review the lawfulness of the Three Card Poker Progressive Jackpot; (2) notify all law enforcement agencies and gambling establishments if further review determines the Three Card Poker Progressive Jackpot to be unlawful; (3) require gambling establishments to cease and desist offering for play the Three Card Poker Progressive Jackpot if found to be unlawful; and (4) take action against those gambling establishments that decline to abide by the Bureau scase and desist notification.

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in the Lucky Chances Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods.
- Qualifying hands and corresponding prize amounts.
- Administrative fees.
- "Double Jackpot" eligibility (including times, dates, and funding source).
- No Purchase Necessary Information.
- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity.

Eligible Controlled Games

The Three Card Poker Progressive shall be attached to the following Bureau approved controlled games offered at Lucky Chances Casino, as shown below, at all times this gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

- Three Card Poker (GEGA-000930)
- Three Card Poker 6-Card Bonus (GEGA-003242)

Object and Summary

A player may win a progressive or fixed jackpot prize by making a predetermined qualifying hand listed below. A qualifying progressive prize is made using a combination of the player's three cards and the player-dealer's three cards. A qualifying fixed prize is made using only the player's three card hand.

- 1. To begin each round, players must make their regular base game wager. They may optionally place any bonus bet wagers along with the jackpot fee of \$1.00. A minimum of two players are required to play for the progressive jackpot.
- 2. "Hockey Puck" discs will be attached to the table in front of each betting position. These discs have a sensor and will detect when a casino chip is placed on them. Players must place the optional jackpot fee on the sensor. The sensor will then light up.



- 3. Once all players place their bets and/or jackpot fee, the house dealer will press "Coin In" on the keypad. The sensors will then light up, indicating participation in the progressive jackpot. The house dealer will then remove all jackpot fees from the table. The jackpot fees are dropped in a separate and locked jackpot collection box affixed to the gaming table.
- 4. The electronic software and digital reader related to and used in conjunction with this jackpot, which is used on each table eligible for this jackpot, has been tested, approved, and certified by the Gaming Laboratories International, LLC (GLI).
- 5. The house dealer then follows standard approved procedures for dealing the base game.

Qualifying Hands

When a player is dealt an ace, king, queen, jack, and ten of the same suit (utilizing both their three card hand and the player-dealer's three card hand), they are paid from the progressive jackpot shown on the progressive meter. Any Mini Royal Flush, which is a hand that consists of an ace, king, and queen of the same suit, receives a fixed prize amount, paid from the reserve fund, according to the pay table below. Any Straight Flush, a hand that consists of three cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking, other than ace, king and queen, receives a fixed prize amount, paid from the reserve fund, according to the pay table below. Mini Royal Flushes and Straight Flushes are not deducted from the amount shown on the meter. A player paying the \$1.00 jackpot fee also qualifies to win an envy payout. If another player at the table hits a hand associated with an envy pay, all other players who paid the \$1.00 jackpot fee win the envy pay.

Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the pre-determined specified hours designated and posted for the gaming activity.

- Only players that have placed a jackpot collection fee are eligible for a jackpot or 'Envy' payout.
- Only players seated at the table, and dealt a designated hand, are eligible to win. Backline bettors are not eligible to receive the prize amount for a designated hand.
- A minimum of two (2) players, a player and a player-dealer, must be dealt into the game in order for the table to qualify for the jackpot.
- When a qualifying hand is announced, a floor person will verify that the hand qualifies. Any deviation from a standard deck will nullify the hand.
- In the event that during a round of play, two (2) or more players have qualifying hands, each player will receive the posted prize amount for their designated hand.



- When a player is dealt a qualifying designated hand, that player will receive 100% of the prize amount.
- Players that place a jackpot collection fee are eligible to receive an Envy payout when any player seated at the table completes a pre-determined and designated Envy hand during a qualifying game. However, a player cannot win an Envy bonus payout for their own hand. Furthermore, if the player-dealer is dealt a qualifying Envy hand, the table does not qualify for an 'Envy' payout.
- Third-Party Providers of Proposition Player Services (TPPPS) are not eligible to place a \$1 jackpot fee and may not receive a fixed, progressive, or Envy prize while in the player or player-dealer position.
- There is no limit to how many times a player may win a fixed, envy bonus, or progressive prize.
- A player in the player-dealer position may not pay the \$1 jackpot fee and shall not be eligible for a prize.
- If a player surrenders their ANTE wager and fails to make a PLAY wager in live game play, they will still be eligible to win both a fixed prize and progressive prize, as long as the \$1 jackpot fee was made prior to the start of the hand.
- This gaming activity is not eligible in tournament play.
- Prizes are paid out immediately after all necessary paperwork is completed.

<u>Prize</u>

Progressive Prize

- When a player is dealt an ace, king, queen, jack and ten of the same suit, using the player's three cards and the player-dealer's three cards they are paid from the progressive jackpot shown on the progressive meter.
- All other hands are paid from the reserve fund. They do not get deducted from the amount shown on the meter.
- When more than one progressive meter pay hits, one progressive payout will be paid from the meter and the others will be paid from the reserve fund.
- When a player has a progressive winner, the dealer shall press the appropriate hand button on the keypad.
- The house dealer shall then contact the floor person.
- Once the casino verifies the progressive win, the floor person shall insert the key and rotate it to "JPH" and then press "J-pot" button. This records the win onto the Game Manager. House procedures are then followed for paying the prize.
- Returning the key to the "Run" position will restore normal operation of the table, and adjust the meter appropriately for the prize won.
- When the house dealer reconciles all action (on behalf of the player/dealer), he/she presses "Game Over." This resets the system to begin the next hand.
- Once the "J-pot" button is pressed, the prize is logged into Game Manager.



Fixed Prize

- When a player is dealt a mini royal flush or a straight flush, they are paid a fixed prize amount according to the payout table above.
- All fixed payouts will be paid by a Casino floor person. Once the proper paperwork has been filled out, the floor person will pay the winner(s) in casino chips. The payouts will not be made from the Casino dealer's tray. All fixed payouts will be deducted from the amount in the reserve fund.
- All monies collected and paid out shall be tracked both electronically and on a hand written log that will be maintained for examination by regulatory and law enforcement personnel.

Envy Bonus

- A player paying the \$1.00 jackpot fee qualifies to win an envy payout. If another player at the table hits a hand associated with an envy pay, all other players who paid the \$1.00 jackpot fee will win the envy pay. The player hitting the hand received the normal prize pay only, but does NOT receive the envy pay.
- If a player's hand triggers an envy payout, the house dealer will leave the hand face-up on the layout; otherwise, the dealer will lock up the cards. The dealer will then move on to the next player.
- The house dealer pays any envy bonuses at the end of the round. In the event that more than one player is involved in a qualifying envy pay, then all players win multiple envy payouts.

Prize Payout Structure

Players who achieve a Royal Flush progressive prize will be awarded 100% of the posted jackpot prize. Players who achieve a Mini Royal Flush fixed prize payout will be awarded \$500. Players who achieve a Straight Flush fixed prize payout will be awarded \$100. If another player achieves a Royal Flush progressive prize, all other players who paid the jackpot fee will be awarded \$100 from the Envy Bonus.

The Casino may offer "Double Jackpot" hours. Days and times for "Double Jackpots" will be clearly defined and advertised in literature and casino signage. The amount of any qualifying jackpot hand won during the predetermined "Double Jackpot" times will be twice the posted prize amount. All extra prize amount relating to "Double Jackpot" shall be funded by the Three Card Poker Progressive Jackpot reserve fund. "Double Jackpot" will not be offered if the Three Card Poker Progressive Jackpot reserve fund cannot cover the extra prize amount. Lucky Chances Casino will cover any shortfall, if needed.

Funding

The Casino will initially seed the jackpot at \$1,000. Once there are sufficient monies in the Three Card Poker Progressive Jackpot reserve fund, the initial \$1,000 will be reimbursed to the Casino. Lucky Chances Casino will cover any shortfall if needed. Once there are sufficient monies in the Three Card Poker Progressive Jackpot reserve fund, the Casino will be reimbursed. All funds shall be tracked in the Casino's accounting paperwork.

Each \$1.00 jackpot fee paid by a player will be broken down as follows:

• \$0.15 will be immediately posted on the meter.



• \$0.85 will be tracked in a reserve fund. The reserve fund will be utilized to; payout all fixed prize amounts; reseed the metered progressive jackpot prize between \$1,000 and \$100,000; and pay the administrative fee of \$6 to \$12 per table per hour.

Administrative Fees

The Casino shall retain an administrative fee of \$6 to \$12 per table per hour from the jackpot reserve fund. The administrative fee shall be utilized to cover expenses incurred by the Casino for administering the Three Card Poker Progressive Jackpot.

No Purchase Necessary

The Three Card Poker Progressive shall be offered to customers who wish to participate for free, on a general and indiscriminate basis, with <u>no restrictions</u>, to patrons who wish to participate in a No Purchase Necessary game. Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Lucky Chances Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods
- Lucky Chip values
- Buy-in amount for Lucky Chips
- Limit to the amount of Buy-in's
- Procedures to redeem Lucky Chips
- Any other applicable restrictions and/or information

Eligible Controlled Games

The Lucky Chips Promotion shall be attached to all Bureau approved California games offered at Lucky Chances Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

The Lucky Chips Promotion will be open to all players who buy-in to a predetermined and posted game, for a predetermined and posted amount ranging from \$100 to \$100,000. Those players will receive standard live casino chips ("casino chips") in the amount of their buy-in and will also receive a predetermined and posted amount of Lucky Chips ranging from \$10 to \$10,000, which are to be used to buy-in to a predetermined and posted game.

The Lucky Chips are of a different style and design from the live casino chips. The Lucky Chips cannot be exchanged for cash and must be played on the gaming table for the predetermined game. Once the Lucky Chip(s) has been placed as a wager, the following applies:

- If the player wins, the player will receive live casino chip(s) for their bet from the playerdealer.
 - The player retains the Lucky Chip(s) to be used again on another wager.
- If the player pushes, the Lucky Chip(s) will remain with the player until the hand loses.

Funding

The Lucky Chips Promotion will be fully funded by Lucky Chances Casino. There will be no additional fees or collections taken for this gaming activity.

Administrative Fees

The Casino shall not retain any administrative fee, as this promotion is house funded.

No Purchase Necessary

The Lucky Chips Promotion does not contain the element of chance. Therefore, it does not constitute an illegal lottery and does not require a No Purchase Necessary table to be offered while conducting this gaming activity.

- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity.

Eligible Controlled Games

The Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive Jackpot shall be attached to the following Bureau approved controlled games offered at the Lucky Chances Casino, as shown below, at all times that this gaming activity is being offered for play. All controlled game rules shall be played as previously approved by the Bureau.

Object and Summary

The Ultimate Texas Hold'em Progressive considers the best advertised qualifying hand(s) among each individual player's cards. A player may win a progressive or fixed prize by placing an optional \$1 jackpot fee and making one of the predetermined hands listed below. Also, a player who places an optional \$1 jackpot fee qualifies to win an Envy payout.

- 1. To begin each round, players must make their regular base game wager. They may optionally place any bonus bet wagers along with the jackpot fee of \$1. "Hockey Puck" discs will be attached to the table in front of each betting position. These discs have a sensor and will detect when a casino chip is placed on them. Players must place the optional jackpot fee on the sensor. The sensor will then light up.
- 2. Once all players place their bets and/or jackpot fee, the house dealer will press "Coin In" on the keypad. The sensors will then light up, indicating participation in the progressive jackpot. Eligibility Requirements

- Only seated players, who are dealt a designated hand, are eligible for payouts.
- A minimum of two players, a player and a player-dealer, are required to play for the progressive jackpot.
- Backline bettors are not eligible to place a jackpot collection fee or receive the prize amount for a qualifying hand.

Equipment

The electronic software and digital reader related to and used in conjunction with this jackpot, which is used on each table eligible for this jackpot, has been tested, approved, and certified by the Gaming Laboratories International, LLC (GLI).

- 1. When a player has a progressive winner, the dealer shall press the appropriate hand button on the keypad.
- 2. The house dealer shall then contact a casino representative.
- 3. Once the casino verifies the progressive win, the casino representative shall insert the key, rotate it to "JPH," and then press "J-pot" button. This records the win onto the Game Manager. House procedures are then followed for paying the prize.
- 4. Returning the key to the "Run" position will restore normal operation of the table, and adjust the meter appropriately for the prize won.
- 5. When the house dealer reconciles all action (on behalf of the player-dealer), they press "Game Over." This resets the system to begin the next hand.
- 6. Once the "J-pot" button is pressed, the prize is logged into Game Manager.

Bureau Requirements

Advertising

Lucky Chances Casino may advertise various names for this gaming activity. <u>Should the</u> <u>Casino advertise a different name, the BGC ID (GEAR-000353) shall be referenced on all</u> <u>advertisements relating to this gaming activity.</u>

Furthermore, all rules and procedures for the gaming activity, including but not limited to the following, shall be prominently displayed in Lucky Chances Casino at all times the gaming activity is being offered for play:

- Eligible games and time periods
- Qualifying hands and corresponding prizes
- Jackpot fee required
- The prize amount that shall be awarded and how it shall be distributed between all eligible players
- Any prize multiplier
- Any other restrictions that apply to this gaming activity

Object and Summary

The Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot gaming activity features player-dealer funded fixed and progressive jackpot prizes. A prize is awarded to players, who have made a base game wager and paid a collection fee (if applicable) in a designated Baccarat game, when a qualifying hand has been obtained. Qualifying hands are determined by cards dealt from the card shoe, in order, to both the "Player" and "Dealer" hands, as detailed below. After the hand is confirmed, those players who made a base game wager and paid a collection fee shall receive the posted prize from the progressive jackpot. If more than one player qualifies for the posted prize, the prize shall be split amongst qualifying players.

Qualifying Hands

When one of the qualifying hands listed out below is obtained during a round of play, all players who made a base game wager and paid a collection fee (if applicable) shall be eligible to win their share of the posted Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot fixed or progressive prize amount, as shown below. The payout for the posted progressive amount shall be equally divided among the player(s) who placed a base game wager and paid a collection fee (if applicable) and the posted fixed amount will be split amongst each player who placed a base game wager and paid a collection fee (if applicable) and the posted fixed amount will be split amongst each player who placed a base game wager and paid a collection fee (if applicable). If there are more than five (5) qualifying players for a fixed prize, each player will receive the alternate "Minimum Prize Amount," as listed out below. Eligibility Requirements

This gaming activity shall be open to all players who are seated and playing at any of the above listed controlled games during the predetermined specified hours posted for the gaming activity.

- There is no minimum amount of time that must be played by a player in order for them to qualify for this jackpot.
- There is no maximum number of times a player may qualify for this jackpot.
- There must be at least two players (one player and the player-dealer) in order for this game to become eligible for the jackpot.
- Employees are eligible for this promotion if they are off duty and out of uniform.
- Third-Party Providers of Proposition Player Services are not eligible for this promotion.
- The person in the player-dealer position is eligible for their portion of the jackpot, as long as that person is not an employee of the Third-Party Providers for Proposition Player Services.

<u>Prize</u>

The jackpot prize is fixed and progressive with a minimum value of \$100 and a maximum of \$200,000. The jackpot prize shall be paid in the form of live casino chips, cash, or check. The actual progressive jackpot prize amount shall depend on the amount the jackpot was originally seeded at, as well as how much time was accumulated in order for the jackpot to increase progressively each day. The jackpot prize will be paid out after all verifications and forms are completed.

Prize Multiplier

Prize Multiplier is an optional element of the Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot. The Prize Multiplier element allows the Casino to increase the progressive prize amount by multiplying the prize pool amount by a predetermined and posted multiplier. The multiplier will range between 2x and 5x. The Casino will be able to offer the Prize Multiplier during specific, days, hours, game limits, or tables as long as it is predetermined and posted. <u>Funding</u>

The Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot is funded through a \$1 collection fee, which shall be taken each hand from the person in the player-dealer position. This fee will be in addition to any regular collection fees paid. All jackpot fees taken will be placed into a separate drop box affixed to each qualifying table. The Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot utilizes one jackpot prize pool. The Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot will be initially seeded by the Lucky Chances Casino in an amount ranging from \$1,000-\$100,000. Once there are sufficient monies in the Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot reserve fund, the initial seed will be reimbursed to the Casino and shall be documented in the accounting records. The Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot increases daily according to the chart below at predetermined and designated times. Once the jackpot has reached the maximum cap amount, all collection fees taken will be placed into a reserve fund. When the jackpot is hit, it will be reseeded from the reserve fund in an amount ranging from \$1,000-\$100,000. In the event that the reserve fund is somehow depleted, the Lucky Chances Casino will reseed the jackpot at \$5,000. Once there are sufficient monies in the jackpot reserve fund, the reseed amount will be reimbursed to the Lucky Chances Casino and shall be documented in the accounting records. The jackpot prize amount may be capped in an amount ranging from \$10,000-\$200,000. The cap for the jackpot will not increase or decrease until the jackpot has been hit. All fixed prizes will be paid from the reserve fund for the Royal Tie Baccarat Jackpot. In the event that the reserve fund is somehow depleted, the Lucky Chances Casino will cover the shortfall and be reimbursed once funds are available from the reserve fund.
