 - Inter-stop cooccurrences






Scope of Presentation

- 533 agencies reported a total of 5,065,428 stops in 2024

 - Race or Ethnicity
 - Gender
 - Age

 - Sexual Orientation
 - Unhoused Status




Average Number of Actions Taken During Stop by Perceived Race/Ethnicity








Average Number of Actions Taken During a Stop with Actions by Perceived Race/Ethnicity






Actions Taken During Stop by Perceived Race/Ethnicity






Most Frequent Results of Stop by Perceived Race/Ethnicity







Average Number of Actions Taken During Stop by Perceived Gender






Average Number of Actions Taken During a Stop with Actions by Perceived Gender








Actions Taken During Stop by Perceived Gender






Most Frequent Results of Stop by Perceived Gender






Average Number of Actions Taken During Stop by Perceived Age Group






Average Number of Actions Taken During a Stop with Actions by Perceived Age Group






Actions Taken During Stop by Perceived Age Group






Most Frequent Results of Stop by Perceived Age Group





During a Stop with Actions by Perceived Disability Status




Actions Taken During Stop by Perceived Disability Status


Most Frequent Results of Stop by Perceived Disability Status







Average Number of Actions Taken During a Stop with Actions by Perceived Sexual Orientation






Most Frequent Results of Stop by Perceived Sexual Orientation


Percent of Stops by Perceived Housing Status







Average Number of Actions Taken During a Stop with Actions by Perceived Housing Status and English Fluency








Actions Taken During Stop by Perceived English Fluency




Percent of Stops for each Perceived Race/Ethnicity Involving Perceived Unhoused Individuals

Percent of Stops for each Perceived Race/Ethnicity Involving Individuals with Perceived Limited English Fluency






- The Board sought to investigate which elements of stops tend to occur together and whether each step of a stop (initiation/perceived demographics -> action during stop -> result of stop) is influenced by the previous steps.
 - The research questions were:
 - 1) What actions are most likely to co-occur during a stop?
 - 2) How do perceived demographics change the odds of certain actions being taken?
 - 3) How do actions during stop impact the odds of certain outcomes of stops when they begin with similar conditions?





How do perceived demographics change the odds of certain actions being taken?



How do perceived demographics change the odds of certain actions being taken?



How do perceived demographics (but not actions taken) change the odds of being arrested?


- action during stop
