

Racial & Identity Profiling Advisory Board Subcommittees

1. Stop Data Analysis Subcommittee

- Review stop data and data analyses from DOJ Research Center of identity categories, including intersectional analyses
- Review policy-related data analyses requested by Policies & Accountability subcommittee
- Review methodologies for data analysis and discuss accessibility and limitations regarding methodologies
- Review proposed changes regarding stop data elements in RIPA regulations

2. Civilian Complaints Subcommittee

- Analyze total citizen complaint data submitted by law enforcement agencies and complaint data that alleges racial or identity profiling
- Analyze LEA investigative procedures and remedies for substantiated complaints
- Develop recommendations for collecting, adjudicating, and resolving complaints

3. POST Training and Recruitment Subcommittee

- Review and provide feedback on POST's existing trainings on implicit bias, procedural justice, and racial or identity profiling
- Develop recommendations for revising the POST training on racial and identity profiling, and for additional actions POST can take to continue to eradicate profiling in policing
- Participate in assessments of the pilot Train-the-Trainer, 8-hour Principled Policing, Self-Paced Refresher, and DOJ POST Certified courses
- Recommend community leaders to participate in POST training content creation and review and feedback sessions

4. State and Local Racial and Identity Profiling Policies and Accountability Subcommittee

- Review and analyze mechanisms of accountability in law enforcement agencies and municipalities develop best practice recommendations regarding accountability
- Determine focused policy subjects to conduct in-depth research and analysis for each Report
- Analyze data to develop data-driven policy recommendations to reduce disparities in law enforcement stops and searches
