1.5 1 "Paint or other Surface Coatings" means a fluid, semi-fluid, or other material, 2 with or without a suspension of finely divided coloring matter, which changes to a solid film 3 when a thin layer is applied to a metal, wood, stone, paper, leather, cloth, plastic, or other surface. 4 This term does not include printing inks or those materials which actually become a part of the 5 substrate, such as the pigment in a plastic article, or those materials which are actually bonded to 6 the substrate, such as by electroplating or ceramic glazing. 7 1.6 "Vendor" means a person or entity that Manufactures, imports, distributes, 8 assembles or supplies a Covered Product to Settling Defendant.

### INTRODUCTION

10 2.1 The parties to this Consent Judgment ("Parties") are the Center for
11 Environmental Health ("CEH") and defendant J. Marcus Wholesalers, Inc. ("Settling
12 Defendant").

13 On November 15, 2013, CEH served a 60-Day Notice of Violation under 2.2 14 Proposition 65 (The Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, California Health 15 & Safety Code §§ 25249.5, et seq.) (the "Notice") to Settling Defendant, the California Attorney 16 General, the District Attorneys of every County in the State of California, and the City Attorneys 17 for every City in the State of California with a population greater than 750,000. The Notice 18 alleges that Settling Defendant violated Proposition 65 by exposing persons to Lead contained in 19 Covered Products, without first providing a clear and reasonable Proposition 65 warning. 20 2.3 On December 31, 2013, CEH filed the action entitled CEH v. ANGL, Inc., et 21 al., Case No. RG 13-708572, in the Superior Court of California for Alameda County. On 22 February 5, 2014, CEH named Settling Defendant as a defendant in that action. 23 2.4 Settling Defendant manufactures, distributes and/or offers for sale Covered 24 Products in the State of California or has done so in the past. 25 2.5 For purposes of this Consent Judgment only, the Parties stipulate that this 26 Court has jurisdiction over the allegations of violations contained in the operative Complaint 27 applicable to Settling Defendant (the "Complaint") and personal jurisdiction over Settling

Defendant as to the acts alleged in the Complaint, that venue is proper in the County of Alameda,
 and that this Court has jurisdiction to enter this Consent Judgment.

3 2.6 Nothing in this Consent Judgment is or shall be construed as an admission by 4 the Parties of any fact, conclusion of law, issue of law or violation of law, nor shall compliance 5 with the Consent Judgment constitute or be construed as an admission by the Parties of any fact, 6 conclusion of law, issue of law, or violation of law. Nothing in this Consent Judgment shall 7 prejudice, waive or impair any right, remedy, argument or defense the Parties may have in any 8 other legal proceeding. This Consent Judgment is the product of negotiation and compromise and 9 is accepted by the Parties for purposes of settling, compromising and resolving issues disputed in 10 this action.

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#### **3. INJUNCTIVE RELIEF**

3.1 Specification Compliance Date. To the extent it has not already done so, no
 more than 30 days after the Effective Date, Settling Defendant shall provide the Lead Limits to its
 Vendors of Covered Products and shall instruct each Vendor to use reasonable efforts to provide
 Covered Products that comply with the Lead Limits on a nationwide basis.

163.2Lead Limits. Commencing on May 15, 2014, Settling Defendant shall initiate17a date coding program where by the labeling attached to or included with a Covered Product at18the time of manufacture reflects the manufacture date for such Covered Product. Thereafter,19Settling Defendant shall not purchase, import, Manufacture, supply to an unaffiliated third party,20or sell or offer for sale any Covered Product that will be sold or offered for sale to California21consumers that contains a material or is made of a component that exceeds the following Lead22Limits:

3.2.1 Paint or other Surface Coatings: 90 parts per million ("ppm").

3.2.2 Polyvinyl chloride ("PVC"): 200 ppm.

3.2.3 All other materials or components other than cubic zirconia (sometimes
called cubic zirconium, CZ), crystal, glass or rhinestones: 300 ppm.

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Action Regarding Specific Products.

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1	3.3.1 On or before the Effective Date, Settling Defendant shall cease selling the		
2	following specific products that were manufactured prior to May 15, 2014 in California:

10	Defendant shall also: (i) cease shipping the Section 3.3 Products to any of its stores and/or		
11	customers that resell the Section 3.3 Products in California, and (ii) send instructions to its		
12	stores and/or customers that resell the Section 3.3 Products in California instructing them		
13	either to return all of the Section 3.3 Products to Settling Defendant who shall not resell or		
14	otherwise distribute such Covered Products in California or to any entity that may offer		
15	them for sale in California whether over the internet or otherwise.		
16	3.3.2 Within sixty days of the Effective Date, Settling Defendant shall provide		
17	CEH with written certification from Settling Defendant confirming compliance with the		
18	requirements of this Section 3.3.		
19	4. ENFORCEMENT		
20	4.1 Any Party may, after meeting and conferring, by motion or application for an		
21	order to show cause before this Court, enforce the terms and conditions contained in this Consent		
22	Judgment. Enforcement of the terms and conditions of Section 3.2 of this Consent Judgment		
23	shall be brought exclusively pursuant to Sections 4.2 through 4.3.		
24	4.2 <b>Notice of Violation.</b> CEH may seek to enforce the requirements of Section		
25	3.2 by issuing a Notice of Violation pursuant to this Section 4.2.		
26	4.2.1 Service of Notice. CEH shall serve the Notice of Violation on Settling		
27	Defendant within 45 days of the date the alleged violation(s) was or were observed,		
28	provided, however, that: (i) CEH may have up to an additional 45 days to provide Settling		
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Defendant with the test data required by Section 4.2.2(d) below if it has not yet obtained it from its laboratory; and (ii) CEH may also serve a Notice of Violation to a supplier of a Covered Product so long as: (a) the identity of the supplier cannot be discerned from the labeling of the Covered Product; and (b) the Notice of Violation to the supplier is served within 45 days of the date the supplier is identified by CEH.

Supporting Documentation. The Notice of Violation shall, at a minimum, 4.2.2 set forth for each Covered Product: (a) the date(s) the alleged violation(s) was observed, (b) the location at which the Covered Product was offered for sale, (c) a description of the Covered Product giving rise to the alleged violation, and of each material or component that is alleged not to comply with the Lead Limits, including a picture of the Covered Product and all identifying information on tags and labels, and (d) all test data obtained by CEH regarding the Covered Product and related supporting documentation, including all laboratory reports, quality assurance reports and quality control reports associated with testing of the Covered Products. Such Notice of Violation shall be based at least in part upon total acid digest testing performed by an independent accredited laboratory. Wipe, swipe, x-ray fluorescence, and swab testing are not by themselves sufficient to support a Notice of Violation, although any such testing may be used as additional support for a Notice. The Parties agree that the sample Notice of Violation attached hereto as Exhibit A is sufficient in form to satisfy the requirements of subsections (c) and (d) of this Section 4.2.2.

4.2.3 Additional Documentation. CEH shall promptly make available for inspection and/or copying upon request by and at the expense of Settling Defendant, all supporting documentation related to the testing of the Covered Products and associated quality control samples, including chain of custody records, all laboratory logbook entries for laboratory receiving, sample preparation, and instrumental analysis, and all printouts from all analytical instruments relating to the testing of Covered Product samples and any and all calibration, quality assurance, and quality control tests performed or relied upon in conjunction with the testing of the Covered Products, obtained by or available to CEH that

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1	pertains to the Covered Product's alleged noncompliance (or compliance) with Section 3		
2	and, if available, any exemplars of Covered Products tested.		
3	4.2.4 <b>Multiple Notices.</b> If Settling Defendant has received more than four		
4	Notices of Violation in any 12-month period, at CEH's option, CEH may seek whatever		
5	fines, costs, penalties, or remedies are provided by law for failure to comply with the		
6	Consent Judgment. For purposes of determining the number of Notices of Violation		
7	pursuant to this Section 4.2.4, the following shall be excluded:		
8	(a) Multiple notices identifying Covered Products Manufactured for or		
9	sold to Settling Defendant from the same Vendor; and		
10	(b) A Notice of Violation that meets one or more of the conditions of		
11	Section 4.3.3(c).		
12	4.3 <b>Notice of Election.</b> Within 30 days of receiving a Notice of Violation		
13	pursuant to Section 4.2, including all test data required pursuant to 4.2.2(d), Settling Defendant		
14	shall provide written notice to CEH stating whether it elects to contest the allegations contained in		
15	the Notice of Violation ("Notice of Election"). Failure to provide a Notice of Election shall be		
16	deemed an election to contest the Notice of Violation. Any contributions to the Fashion		
17	Accessory Testing Fund required under this Section 4.3 shall be made payable to The Center for		
18	Environmental Health and included with Settling Defendant's Notice of Election.		
19	4.3.1 <b>Contested Notices.</b> If the Notice of Violation is contested, the Notice of		
20	Election shall include all then-available documentary evidence regarding the alleged		
21	violation, including any test data. Within 30 days the parties shall meet and confer to		
22	attempt to resolve their dispute. Should such attempts at meeting and conferring fail,		
23	CEH may file an enforcement motion or application pursuant to Section 4.1. If Settling		
24	Defendant withdraws its Notice of Election to contest the Notice of Violation before any		
25	motion concerning the violations alleged in the Notice of Violation is filed pursuant to		
26	Section 4.1, Settling Defendant shall make a contribution to the Proposition 65 Fashion		
27	Accessory Testing Fund in the amount of \$12,500 and shall comply with all of the non-		
28	monetary provisions of Section 4.3.2. If, at any time prior to reaching an agreement or

obtaining a decision from the Court, CEH or Settling Defendant acquires additional test or other data regarding the alleged violation, it shall promptly provide all such data or information to the other Party.

4.3.2 **Non-Contested Notices.** If the Notice of Violation is not contested, Settling Defendant shall include in its Notice of Election a detailed description of corrective action that it has undertaken or proposes to undertake to address the alleged violation. Any such correction shall, at a minimum, provide reasonable assurance that the Covered Product will no longer be offered by Settling Defendant or its customers for sale in California. If there is a dispute over the sufficiency of the proposed corrective action or its implementation, CEH shall promptly notify Settling Defendant and the Parties shall meet and confer before seeking the intervention of the Court to resolve the dispute. In addition to the corrective action, Settling Defendant shall make a contribution to the Fashion Accessory Testing Fund in the amount of \$10,000, unless one of the provisions of Section 4.3.3 applies.

#### 4.3.3 Limitations in Non-Contested Matters.

(a) If it elects not to contest a Notice of Violation before any motion concerning the violation(s) at issue has been filed, the monetary liability of Settling Defendant shall be limited to the contributions required by Section 4.3.2 and this Section 4.3.3, if any.

(b) If more than one Settling Defendant has manufactured, sold, offered
 for sale or distributed a Covered Product identified in a non-contested Notice of Violation,
 only one required contribution may be assessed against all Settling Defendants as to the
 noticed Covered Product.

(c) The contribution to the Fashion Accessory Testing Fund shall be:
 (i) One thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$1,750) if Settling
 Defendant, prior to receiving and accepting for distribution or sale the
 Covered Product identified in the Notice of Violation, obtained test results
 demonstrating that all of the materials or components in the Covered

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1	Product identified in the Notice of Violation complied with the applicable			
2	Lead Limits, and further provided that such test results meet the same			
3	quality criteria to support a Notice of Violation as set forth in Section 4.2.2			
4	and that the testing was performed within one year of the date of			
5	manufacture of the Covered Product on which the Notice of Violation is			
6	based. Settling Defendant shall provide copies of such test results and			
7	supporting documentation to CEH with its Notice of Election; or			
8	(ii) Not required or payable, if the Notice of Violation identifies			
9	the same Covered Product or Covered Products, differing only in size or			
10	color, that have been the subject of another Notice of Violation within the			
11	preceding 12 months.			
12	5. PAYMENTS			
13	5.1 <b>Payments by Settling Defendant.</b> Within ten (10) business days of the Effective			
14	Date, Settling Defendant shall pay the total sum of \$45,000 as a settlement payment. The total			
15	settlement amount for Settling Defendant shall be paid in three separate checks and delivered to			
16	the offices of the Lexington Law Group (Attn: Eric Somers), 503 Divisadero Street, San			
17	Francisco, California 94117-2212, and made payable and allocated as follows:			
18	5.1.1 Settling Defendant shall pay the sum of \$5,930 as a civil penalty pursuant			
19	to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b). CEH shall apportion this payment in accordance with			
20	Health & Safety Code § 25249.12 (25% to CEH and 75% to the State of California's Office of			
21	Environmental Health Hazard Assessment). The civil penalty check shall be made payable to the			
22	Center For Environmental Health.			
23	5.1.2 Settling Defendant shall pay the sum of \$8,900 as a payment in lieu of civil			
24	penalty to CEH pursuant to Health & Safety Code § 25249.7(b), and California Code of			
25	Regulations, Title 11, § 3203(b). CEH shall use such funds to continue its work educating and			
26	protecting people from exposures to toxic chemicals, including heavy metals. In addition, as part			
27	of its Community Environmental Action and Justice Fund, CEH will use four percent of such			
28	funds to award grants to grassroots environmental justice groups working to educate and protect

people from exposures to toxic chemicals. The method of selection of such groups can be found
 at the CEH web site at <u>www.ceh.org/justicefund</u>. The payment pursuant to this Section shall be
 made payable to the Center For Environmental Health.

5.1.3 Settling Defendant shall also separately pay the sum of \$30,170 to the
Lexington Law Group as reimbursement of a portion of CEH's reasonable attorneys' fees and
costs. The attorneys' fees and cost reimbursement check shall be made payable to the Lexington
Law Group.

## MODIFICATION

9 6.1 Written Consent. This Consent Judgment may be modified from time to
10 time by express written agreement of the Parties with the approval of the Court, or by an order of
11 this Court upon motion and in accordance with law.

12 6.2 Meet and Confer. Any Party seeking to modify this Consent Judgment shall
13 attempt in good faith to meet and confer with all affected Parties prior to filing a motion to
14 modify the Consent Judgment.

# 7. CLAIMS COVERED AND RELEASED

This Consent Judgment is a full, final and binding resolution between CEH, on 16 7.1 17 behalf of itself and the public interest, and Settling Defendant, its parents, subsidiaries, affiliated 18 entities that are under common ownership, directors, officers, employees, and attorneys 19 ("Defendant Releasees"), and each entity to whom they directly or indirectly distribute or sell 20 Covered Products, including but not limited to distributors, wholesalers, customers, retailers, 21 franchisees, cooperative members, licensors, and licensees ("Downstream Defendant Releasees") 22 of any violation of Proposition 65 that was or could have been asserted in the Complaint against 23 Settling Defendant, Defendant Releasees, and Downstream Defendant Releasees, based on failure 24 to warn about alleged exposure to Lead contained in Covered Products that were sold by Settling 25 Defendant prior to May 15, 2014.

26 7.2 Compliance with the Lead Limits set forth in this Consent Judgment by
27 Settling Defendant, Defendant Releasees, and Settling Defendant's Downstream Defendant

1	Releasees constitutes compliance with Proposition 65 by such parties with respect to Lead in		
2	Covered Products sold by Settling Defendant.

For purposes of this Consent Judgment, the term 9 substantial justification shall carry the same meaning as used in the Civil Discovery Act of 1986, 10 Code of Civil Procedure §§ 2016, et seq. 11 10.2 Except as otherwise provided in this Consent Judgment, each Party shall bear 12 its own attorneys' fees and costs. 13 10.3 Nothing in this Section 10 shall preclude a Party from seeking an award of 14 sanctions pursuant to law. 15 **TERMINATION** 11. This Consent Judgment shall be terminable by CEH or by Settling Defendant 16 11.1 17 at any time after January 1, 2020, upon the provision of 30 days advanced written notice; such 18 termination shall be effective upon the subsequent filing of a notice of termination with Superior 19 Court of Alameda County. 20 11.2 Should this Consent Judgment be terminated pursuant to this Section, it shall 21 be of no further force or effect as to the terminated parties; provided, however that if CEH is the 22 terminating Party, the provisions of Sections 5 and 7 shall survive any termination and provided 23 further that if Settling Defendant is the terminating Party, the provisions of Sections 5 and 7.1 24 shall survive any termination.

**25 12. OTHER TERMS** 

26 12.1 The terms of this Consent Judgment shall be governed by the laws of the State
27 of California.

12.2This Consent Judgment shall apply to and be binding upon CEH and Settling

1 Defendant, and the successors or assigns of any of them.

2 12.3 This Consent Judgment contains the sole and entire agreement and 3 understanding of the Parties with respect to the entire subject matter hereof, and any and all prior 4 discussions, negotiations, commitments, or understandings related thereto, if any, are hereby 5 merged herein. There are no warranties, representations, or other agreements between the Parties 6 except as expressly set forth herein. No representations, oral or otherwise, express or implied, 7 other than those specifically referred to in this Consent Judgment have been made by any Party 8 hereto. No other agreements not specifically contained or referenced herein, oral or otherwise, 9 shall be deemed to exist or to bind any of the Parties hereto. No supplementation, modification, 10 waiver, or termination of this Consent Judgment shall be binding unless executed in writing by 11 the Party to be bound thereby. No waiver of any of the provisions of this Consent Judgment shall 12 be deemed or shall constitute a waiver of any of the other provisions hereof whether or not 13 similar, nor shall such waiver constitute a continuing waiver.



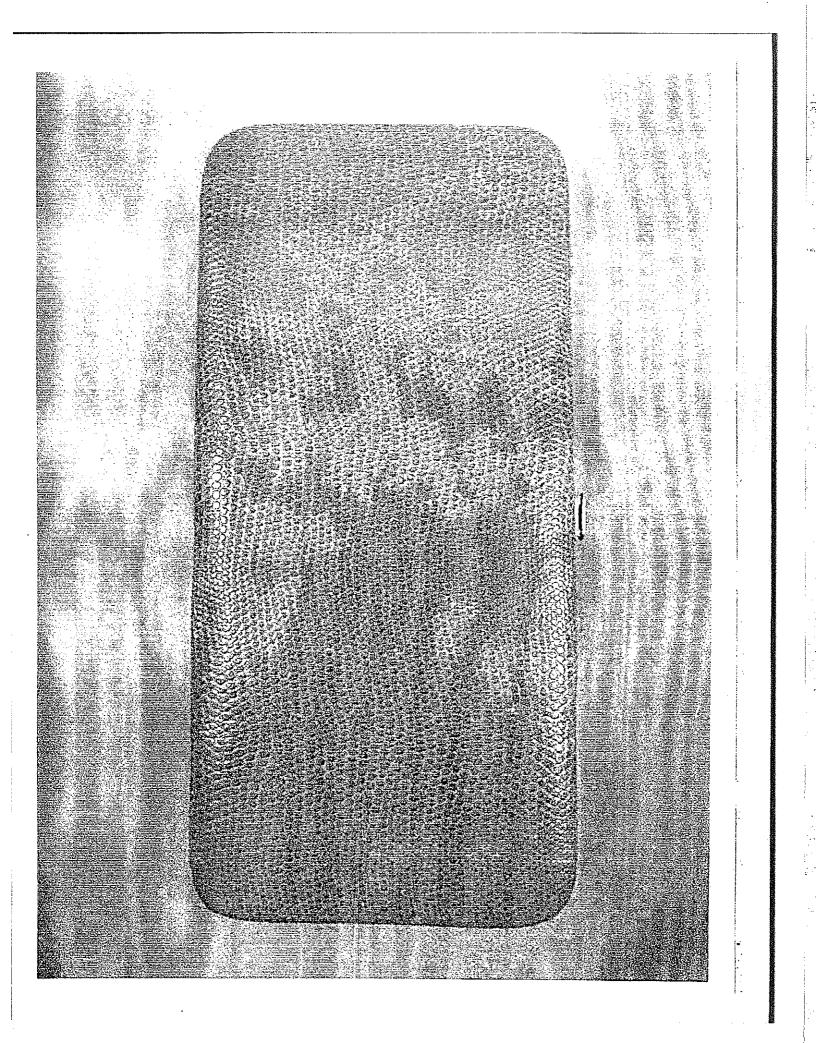

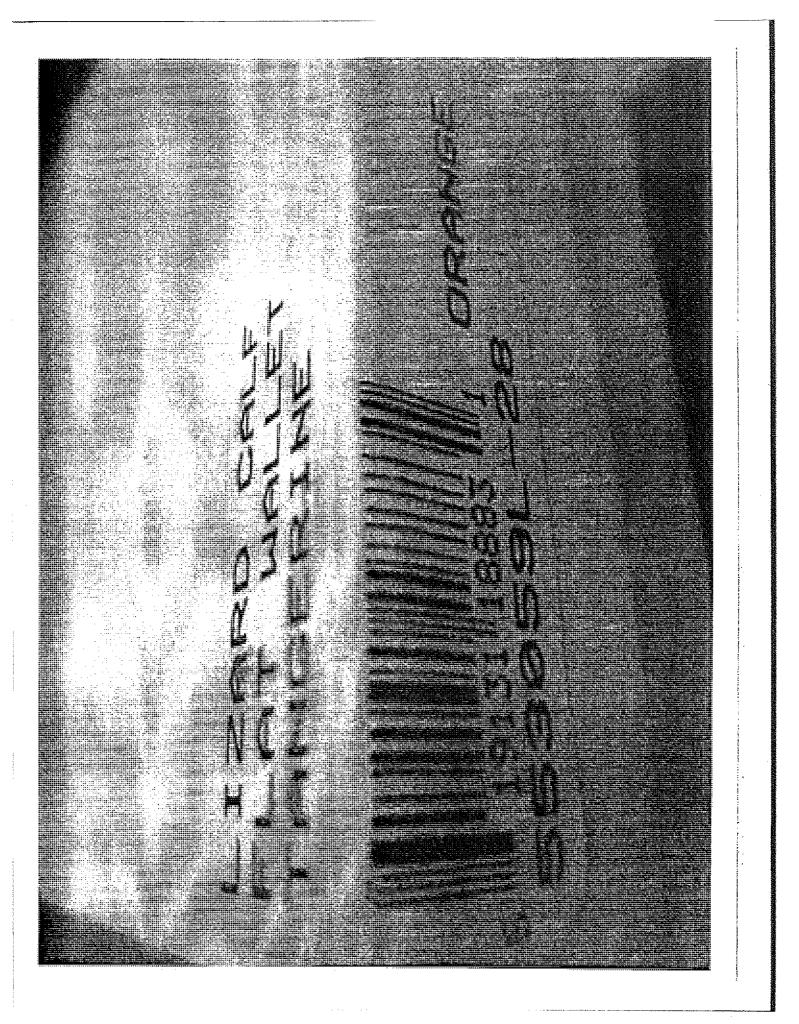
